- 2 relating to required water pressure boosters for certain housing
- 3 developments that receive an allocation of low income housing tax
- 4 credits.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter DD, Chapter 2306, Government Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 2306.6741 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 2306.6741. WATER PRESSURE BOOSTER REQUIRED. (a) This
- 9 section applies only to a development that:
- 10 (1) has received an allocation of low income housing
- 11 tax credits under this subchapter;
- 12 (2) is a multifamily residential development whose
- 13 residential units are reserved for individuals 55 years of age and
- 14 older; and
- 15 (3) is four stories or more in height.
- 16 (b) The department shall require each development to which
- 17 this section applies to be equipped with a water pressure booster
- 18 capable of providing water to each floor of the development during
- 19 <u>an emergency.</u>
- 20 <u>(c) The department may adopt rules to implement this</u>
- 21 section.
- 22 SECTION 2. (a) In this section, "development" means a
- 23 development to which Section 2306.6741, Government Code, as added
- 24 by this Act, applies.

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- 1 (b) The Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs
- 2 shall ensure that each development is in compliance with Section
- 3 2306.6741, Government Code, as added by this Act, not later than
- 4 December 31, 2026. The department may establish a process to carry
- 5 out this subsection in phases.
- 6 (c) Not later than March 1, 2027, the Texas Department of
- 7 Housing and Community Affairs shall prepare and submit to the
- 8 legislature a written report on:
- 9 (1) the overall number of developments in compliance
- 10 with Section 2306.6741, Government Code, as added by this Act; and
- 11 (2) for any development that is not in compliance with
- 12 that section, the reason for the noncompliance and any actions
- 13 taken by the department to ensure compliance with that section.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
