A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to Holocaust education and training provided to students
- 3 enrolled at public schools and public institutions of higher
- 4 education.

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- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 8, Education Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 8.065 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 8.065. COLLABORATION WITH HOLOCAUST MUSEUMS. Each
- 9 regional education service center shall on a regular basis
- 10 <u>collaborate with one or more of the Holocaust museums in this state</u>
- 11 to expand educator training and classroom education opportunities
- 12 regarding Holocaust education.
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 29.9072, Education Code, is amended by
- 14 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (d) and (e) to read
- 15 as follows:
- 16 (a) In this section, "Holocaust" has the meaning assigned by
- 17 Section 448.001 [449.001], Government Code.
- 18 (d) Not later than June 1 of each school year, each school
- 19 <u>district and open-enrollment charter school shall submit to the</u>
- 20 agency a report regarding the Holocaust Remembrance Week
- 21 instruction offered by the district or school for that school year
- 22 under this section. The report must include the activities,
- 23 lessons, and instructional materials used for the instruction.
- (e) As soon as practicable after June 1 of each school year,

- 1 the agency shall compile all reports submitted under Subsection (d)
- 2 for the school year and submit the compiled information to each
- 3 regional education service center and the Texas Holocaust,
- 4 Genocide, and Antisemitism Advisory Commission.
- 5 SECTION 3. Subchapter Z, Chapter 29, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 29.90721 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 29.90721. HOLOCAUST REMEMBRANCE WEEK GRANT PROGRAM.
- 8 (a) In this section:
- 9 (1) "Advisory commission" means the Texas Holocaust,
- 10 Genocide, and Antisemitism Advisory Commission.
- 11 (2) "Commission" means the Texas Historical
- 12 Commission.
- 13 (3) "Holocaust" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 14 448.001, Government Code.
- (b) From money appropriated for purposes of this section,
- 16 the commission, in coordination with the advisory commission, shall
- 17 establish and administer a grant program to provide grants to
- 18 school districts and museums, centers, and other relevant
- 19 organizations in this state to assist in the implementation of
- 20 Holocaust Remembrance Week instruction under Section 29.9072. The
- 21 commission may award a grant for purposes of:
- 22 (1) developing optional, age-appropriate lesson plans
- 23 for classroom teachers who lack relevant subject matter expertise
- 24 regarding the Holocaust;
- 25 (2) sponsoring student field trips to the Holocaust
- 26 museums in this state, with priority given to campuses in urban and
- 27 rural districts;

- 1 (3) providing training approved by the advisory
- 2 committee for educators and for administrators who manage
- 3 professional development and teacher training in each district;
- 4 (4) cataloging and expanding relevant audiovisual and
- 5 digital classroom resources, including resources maintained by
- 6 Holocaust museums in this state; and
- 7 (5) developing, in collaboration with museums,
- 8 bilingual curricula to meet the needs of more students in this state
- 9 and making the curricula available on the advisory commission's
- 10 Internet website.
- 11 (c) The commission, in coordination with the advisory
- 12 commission, shall adopt rules as necessary to establish and
- 13 administer the grant program under this section.
- 14 SECTION 4. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
- 15 amended by adding Section 61.0767 to read as follows:
- Sec. 61.0767. EDUCATOR PREPARATION PILOT PROGRAM TO IMPROVE
- 17 DELIVERY OF HOLOCAUST EDUCATION. (a) The board shall establish a
- 18 pilot program at institutions of higher education selected by the
- 19 board to train students enrolled in an educator preparation program
- 20 to provide more effective instruction related to the history and
- 21 remembrance of the Holocaust. The board may adopt rules as
- 22 necessary to administer this section.
- 23 (b) An institution of higher education selected under this
- 24 section must have an educator preparation program approved by the
- 25 State Board for Educator Certification or be affiliated with a
- 26 program approved by the State Board for Educator Certification.
- 27 (c) At least 50 percent of the institutions of higher

- 1 education selected by the board must be located in an area or likely
- 2 to graduate educators who will teach in a public school in an area
- 3 where the applicable school district has demonstrated low
- 4 participation in Holocaust Remembrance Week instruction.
- 5 (d) The board shall collaborate with the Texas Holocaust,
- 6 Genocide, and Antisemitism Advisory Commission to establish
- 7 minimum curriculum requirements, guidelines, and procedures
- 8 necessary for the implementation of the pilot program.
- 9 (e) The board shall use any funds appropriated or otherwise
- 10 made available for purposes of the pilot program and may accept
- 11 gifts, grants, and donations to fund the pilot program.
- 12 (f) The pilot program shall operate for four full academic
- 13 years.
- 14 (g) An institution of higher education selected for the
- 15 pilot program shall annually report to the board in the manner
- 16 prescribed by the board data and information regarding the
- 17 operation of the pilot program.
- 18 (h) The report required by Subsection (g) must contain, with
- 19 respect to the preceding academic year:
- 20 (1) a description of the manner in which the selected
- 21 institution complied with the purpose of the pilot program and any
- 22 difficulties encountered in complying with that purpose, including
- 23 <u>timelines related to implementing the pilot program;</u>
- 24 (2) data regarding the <u>institution's students</u>
- 25 receiving instruction under the pilot program through an educator
- 26 preparation program;
- 27 (3) information regarding any third-party entities or

- 1 organizations the institution collaborates with to deliver
- 2 instruction under the pilot program through an educator preparation
- 3 program; and
- 4 (4) a survey of educator preparation program students
- 5 and faculty who participated in the pilot program at the
- 6 institution, including feedback regarding the results of the pilot
- 7 program and information regarding the marketability and subsequent
- 8 teaching careers of participating students.
- 9 (i) The board shall compile a biennial report based on the
- 10 data and information received under Subsection (g) regarding the
- 11 operation of the pilot program and the results of the survey of
- 12 educator preparation program students and faculty who participated
- 13 in the pilot program at each of the selected institutions during the
- 14 preceding biennium. Not later than September 1 of each
- 15 odd-numbered year, the board shall deliver a copy of the report to
- 16 the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of
- 17 representatives, and the chair of each standing committee of the
- 18 legislature having primary jurisdiction over higher education.
- 19 (j) The biennial report produced by the board before
- 20 September 1, 2029, must include a recommendation regarding whether
- 21 the pilot program should be continued, expanded, or terminated.
- (k) Before September 1, 2031, the board shall conduct a
- 23 final survey of educator preparation program students and faculty
- 24 who participated in the pilot program at the selected institutions
- 25 at any time during the operation of the program, including feedback
- 26 regarding the results of the pilot program and information
- 27 regarding the marketability and teaching careers of participating

- 1 students. The board shall publish the results of the survey on its
- 2 <u>Internet website</u>.
- 3 (1) The pilot program concludes and this section expires
- 4 December 1, 2031.
- 5 SECTION 5. Section 29.9072, Education Code, as amended by
- 6 this Act, applies beginning with the 2025-2026 school year.
- 7 SECTION 6. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 8 of this Act, the Texas Historical Commission, in coordination with
- 9 the Texas Holocaust, Genocide, and Antisemitism Advisory
- 10 Commission, shall establish the grant program required by Section
- 11 29.90721, Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 12 SECTION 7. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board
- 13 shall select public institutions of higher education for the pilot
- 14 program required under Section 61.0767, Education Code, as added by
- 15 this Act, not later than May 1, 2026.
- SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
