S.B. No. 763

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to standard permits for certain concrete plants.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Section 382.05195, Health and Safety Code, is

5 amended by adding Subsection (e-1) and amending Subsection (k) to

6 read as follows:

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7 <u>(e-1) This subsection applies only to a standard permit</u> 8 <u>issued under this section that authorizes the operation of a</u>

9 permanent concrete plant that performs wet batching, dry batching,

10 or central mixing, as defined by the commission. The commission

11 shall at least once every six years conduct a protectiveness review

12 of the permit regarding the operation of a permanent concrete plant

13 described by this subsection, including by reviewing available

background concentrations of air pollutants. If the commission

15 <u>amends the permit after a protectiveness review, the commission</u>

16 shall allow facilities authorized to emit air contaminants under

17 the permit as it read before the amendment to continue to operate

18 until a date provided by the commission under Subsection (f) that

19 provides facility operators a reasonable amount of time to comply

20 with the amended permit.

21 (k) An application for <u>an authorization to use</u> [the issuance

22 of] a standard permit under this section for a concrete plant that

performs wet batching, dry batching, or central mixing, including a

24 permanent, temporary, or specialty concrete batch plant, as defined

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- 1 by the commission, must include a plot plan that clearly shows:
- 2 (1) a distance scale;
- 3 (2) a north arrow;
- 4 (3) all property lines, emission points, buildings,
- 5 tanks, and process vessels and other process equipment in the area
- 6 in which the facility will be located;
- 7 (4) at least two benchmark locations in the area in
- 8 which the facility will be located; and
- 9 (5) if the permit requires a distance, setback, or
- 10 buffer from other property or structures as a condition of the
- 11 permit, whether the required distance or setback will be met.
- 12 SECTION 2. Not later than March 1, 2026, the Texas
- 13 Commission on Environmental Quality shall adopt rules necessary to
- 14 implement the changes in law made by this Act.
- 15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
