## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to certain files maintained by a law enforcement agency
3	regarding certain employees of the agency.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter J, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 1701.45351 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 1701.45351. DEPARTMENT FILE. (a) In this section,
8	"department file" means a file maintained by a law enforcement
9	agency for each license holder employed by the agency for the
10	agency's use.
11	(b) The head of a law enforcement agency or the head's
12	designee shall maintain a department file on each license holder
13	employed by the agency.
14	(c) A department file must contain any letter, memorandum,
15	or document relating to the license holder not included in a
16	personnel file maintained under a policy adopted under Section
17	1701.4535, including any letter, memorandum, or document relating
18	to alleged misconduct by the license holder for which the agency
19	determines there is insufficient evidence to sustain the charge of
20	misconduct.
21	(d) As provided by Section 1701.451, a law enforcement
22	agency hiring a license holder is entitled to view the contents of
23	the license holder's department file.
24	(e) A law enforcement agency shall provide contents from a

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license holder's department file to the commission in accordance 1 2 with: 3 (1) the law enforcement agency's policy adopted in 4 compliance with Section 1701.4522(b)(1)(D); or 5 (2) a request by the commission as part of an ongoing investigation relating to the license holder. 6 7 (f) A department file maintained under this section is subject to disclosure under Article 39.14, Code of Criminal 8 Procedure, or Section 511.021, Government Code. A law enforcement 9 agency may disclose information contained in a license holder's 10 department file if the disclosure is permitted under a meet and 11 confer agreement entered into before September 1, 2025. 12 13 (g) Except as provided by Subsections (d), (e), and (f), a law enforcement agency may not release any information contained in 14 15 a license holder's department file to any other agency or person 16 requesting information relating to the license holder. The agency shall refer the person or agency requesting the information to the 17 agency head or the head's designee. A department file maintained 18 under this section is confidential and not subject to disclosure 19 under Chapter 552, Government Code. 20

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SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

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
