## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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## AN ACT

2 relating to authorizing the disclosure of certain electronic 3 customer data by a provider of an electronic communications service 4 or a remote computing service in certain immediate life-threatening 5 situations.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

7 SECTION 1. Articles 18B.502(a) and (b), Code of Criminal 8 Procedure, are amended to read as follows:

9 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (c) <u>and Article</u> 10 <u>18B.5025</u>, a provider of an electronic communications service may 11 not knowingly divulge the contents of a communication that is in 12 electronic storage.

(b) Except as provided by Subsection (c) <u>and Article</u> 14 <u>18B.5025</u>, a provider of a remote computing service may not 15 knowingly divulge the contents of a communication that:

16 (1) is in electronic storage on behalf of a subscriber 17 or customer of the service provider;

18 (2) is received by means of electronic transmission 19 from the subscriber or customer or created by means of computer 20 processing of communications received by means of electronic 21 transmission from the subscriber or customer; and

(3) is solely for the purpose of providing storage or
computer processing services to the subscriber or customer, if the
service provider is not authorized to obtain access to the contents

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of that communication for purposes of providing any service other
 than storage or computer processing.

3 SECTION 2. Subchapter K, Chapter 18B, Code of Criminal 4 Procedure, is amended by adding Article 18B.5025 to read as 5 follows:

6 Art. 18B.5025. DISCLOSURE IN IMMEDIATE LIFE-THREATENING 7 SITUATION. A provider of an electronic communications service or a provider of a remote computing service may disclose electronic 8 9 customer data to a law enforcement agency if the provider in good faith believes an immediate life-threatening situation exists that 10 requires the immediate disclosure of the electronic customer data 11 to assist in preventing any death or serious bodily injury that may 12 13 result from the immediate life-threatening situation.

SECTION 3. Article 18B.552, Code of Criminal Procedure, is amended to read as follows:

16 Art. 18B.552. NO CAUSE OF ACTION. (a) A subscriber or customer of a provider of an electronic communications service or a 17 provider of a remote computing service does not have a cause of 18 action against a service provider or the service provider's 19 20 officers, employees, or agents or against other specified persons 21 for providing information, facilities, or assistance as required by a court order, warrant, subpoena, or certification under this 22 23 chapter.

24 (b) A person does not have a cause of action against a 25 provider of an electronic communications service or a provider of a 26 remote computing service or the service provider's officers, 27 employees, or agents for disclosing electronic customer data to a

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## 1 law enforcement agency as authorized by Article 18B.5025.

2 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply to a 3 disclosure of electronic customer data by a provider of an 4 electronic communications service or a remote computing service 5 made on or after the effective date of this Act.

6 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
