3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. The heading to Section 545.305, Transportation
5	Code, is amended to read as follows:
6	Sec. 545.305. <u>AUTHORIZED</u> REMOVAL OF <u>CERTAIN MOTOR VEHICLES</u>

- [UNLAWFULLY STOPPED VEHICLE]. 8 SECTION 2. Section 545.305(a), Transportation Code, is
- amended to read as follows: 9
- A peace officer listed under Article 2A.001, Code of 10 Criminal Procedure, or a license and weight inspector of the 11 department may remove or require the operator or a person in charge 12 13 of a vehicle to move a vehicle from a highway if the vehicle:
- 14 (1) is unattended on a bridge, viaduct, or causeway or 15 in a tube or tunnel and the vehicle is obstructing traffic;
- is unlawfully parked and blocking the entrance to 16 a private driveway; 17
- has been reported as stolen; 18
- 19 is identified as having been stolen in a warrant issued on the filing of a complaint; 20
- (5) is unattended and the officer has reasonable 21
- 22 grounds to believe that the vehicle has been abandoned for longer
- 23 than 48 hours;

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is disabled so that normal operation is impossible 24

- 1 or impractical and the owner or person in charge of the vehicle is:
- 2 (A) incapacitated and unable to provide for the
- 3 vehicle's removal or custody; or
- 4 (B) not in the immediate vicinity of the vehicle;
- 5 (7) is disabled so that normal operation is impossible
- 6 or impractical and the owner or person in charge of the vehicle does
- 7 not designate a particular towing or storage company;
- 8 (8) is operated by a person:
- 9 (A) an officer arrests for an alleged offense and
- 10 the officer is required by law to take the person into custody; or
- 11 (B) in violation of Section 521.021, 521.457,
- 12 601.191, or 729.002; or
- 13 (9) is, in the opinion of the officer, a hazard,
- 14 interferes with a normal function of a governmental agency, or
- 15 because of a catastrophe, emergency, or unusual circumstance is
- 16 imperiled.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
