- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 401.2021, Occupations Code, is amended 6 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 401.2021. RULES FOR HEARING INSTRUMENTS. The [With
- 8 the assistance of the advisory board and the Hearing Instrument
- 9 Fitters and Dispensers Advisory Board, the] commission shall adopt
- 10 rules to establish requirements for each sale of a hearing
- 11 instrument for purposes of this chapter and Chapter 402. The rules
- 12 must:

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- 13 (1) address:
- 14 (A) the information and other provisions
- 15 required in each written contract for the purchase of a hearing
- 16 instrument;
- 17 (B) records that must be retained under this
- 18 chapter or Chapter 402; and
- 19 (C) guidelines for the 30-day trial period during
- 20 which a person may cancel the purchase of a hearing instrument; and
- 21 (2) require that the written contract and 30-day trial
- 22 period information provided to a purchaser of a hearing instrument
- 23 be in plain language designed to be easily understood by the average
- 24 consumer.

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- 1 SECTION 2. Section 402.1021, Occupations Code, is amended
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 402.1021. RULES FOR HEARING INSTRUMENTS. The [With
- 4 the assistance of the advisory board and the Speech-Language
- 5 Pathologists and Audiologists Advisory Board, the] commission
- 6 shall adopt rules to establish requirements for each sale of a
- 7 hearing instrument for purposes of this chapter and Chapter 401.
- 8 The rules must:
- 9 (1) address:
- 10 (A) the information and other provisions
- 11 required in each written contract for the purchase of a hearing
- 12 instrument;
- 13 (B) records that must be retained under this
- 14 chapter or Chapter 401; and
- 15 (C) guidelines for the 30-day trial period during
- 16 which a person may cancel the purchase of a hearing instrument; and

- 21 SECTION 3. Section 402.305, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 22 read as follows:
- 23 Sec. 402.305. CONTINUING EDUCATION EXEMPTIONS. The
- 24 department may renew the license of a license holder who does not
- 25 comply with the applicable continuing education requirements if the
- 26 license holder[+
- 27 [(1) was licensed for the first time during the 24

1 months before the reporting date; or

- 2 $\left[\frac{(2)}{(2)}\right]$ submits proof from an attending physician that
- 3 the license holder suffered a serious or disabling illness or
- 4 physical disability that prevented compliance with the continuing
- 5 education requirements during the 24 months before the reporting
- 6 date.
- 7 SECTION 4. Section 402.402(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 (a) A licensed hearing instrument fitter and dispenser may
- 10 not sell a hearing instrument to a person under 18 years of age
- 11 unless the prospective user or a parent or guardian of the
- 12 prospective user has presented to the hearing instrument fitter and
- 13 dispenser a written statement $[\tau]$ signed by a licensed physician,
- 14 including a physician who specializes [specializing] in diseases of
- 15 the ear, that states that the patient's hearing loss has been
- 16 medically evaluated and that the patient may be considered a
- 17 candidate for a hearing instrument.
- SECTION 5. Section 402.402(a), Occupations Code, as amended
- 19 by this Act, applies only to conduct that occurs on or after the
- 20 effective date of this Act. Conduct that occurs before the
- 21 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 22 date the conduct occurred, and the former law is continued in effect
- 23 for that purpose.
- SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
