## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the licensing and regulation of certain advanced
- 3 practice registered nurses; authorizing a fee.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 ARTICLE 1. SHORT TITLE
- 6 SECTION 1.001. This Act may be cited as the Healthcare
- 7 Expanded and Accessed Locally for Texans (HEAL Texans) Act.
- 8 ARTICLE 2. REGULATION OF ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSES
- 9 SECTION 2.001. Section 301.002, Occupations Code, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 301.002. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
- 12 (1) "Advanced practice registered nurse" means a
- 13 registered nurse licensed by the board to practice as an advanced
- 14 practice registered nurse on the basis of completion of an advanced
- 15 educational program. The term includes a nurse practitioner, nurse
- 16 midwife, nurse anesthetist, and clinical nurse specialist.
- 17 (2) [(1)] "Board" means the Texas Board of Nursing.
- 18  $\underline{\text{(3)}}$  [\frac{\tangle (1-a)}{\tangle}] "Chief nursing officer" means the
- 19 registered nurse who is administratively responsible for the
- 20 nursing services at a facility.
- 21 (4) "Controlled substance" has the meaning assigned by
- 22 <u>Section 481.002</u>, <u>Health and Safety Code</u>.
- 23 (5) "Dangerous drug" has the meaning assigned by
- 24 Section 483.001, Health and Safety Code.

- 1 (6) "Device" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 2 551.003, and <u>includes durable medical equipment.</u>
- 3 (7) "Nonprescription drug" has the meaning assigned by
- 4 <u>Section 551.003.</u>
- 5 (8) "Nurse" means a person required to be licensed
- 6 under this chapter to engage in professional or vocational nursing.
- 7 (9) "Nursing" means professional or vocational
- 8 nursing.
- 9 (10)  $\left[\frac{(1-b)}{1-b}\right]$  "Patient safety committee" has the
- 10 meaning assigned by Section 303.001.
- 11 (11) "Prescribe or order a drug or device" has the
- 12 meaning assigned by Section 157.051.
- 13 (12)  $\left[\frac{(2)}{2}\right]$  "Professional nursing" means the
- 14 performance of an act that requires substantial specialized
- 15 judgment and skill, the proper performance of which is based on
- 16 knowledge and application of the principles of biological,

- 19 acts of medical diagnosis or the prescription of therapeutic or
- 20 corrective measures, except as performed by an advanced practice
- 21 registered nurse authorized to practice by the board under Section

- 24 evaluation, rehabilitation, care and counsel, or health teachings
- 25 of a person who is ill, injured, infirm, or experiencing a change in
- 26 normal health processes;

19	Education or the Council for Higher Education Accreditation or its
20	successor organization and that includes completion of three
21	separate graduate level courses in:
22	(A) advanced physiology and pathophysiology;
23	(B) advanced health assessment; and
24	(C) advanced pharmacology which includes
25	pharmacodynamics, pharmacokinetics, and pharmacotherapeutics of
26	all broad categories of agents; and
27	(3) successfully complete and be currently certified

- 9 (3) treating actual and potential health problems;
- 10 (4) prescribing therapeutic and corrective measures,
- 11 including nutrition and diagnostic support services, home health
- 12 care, hospice care, physical therapy, and occupational therapy, and
- 13 delegating and assigning the performance of therapeutic and
- 14 corrective measures to assistive personnel;
- 15 (5) to the extent authorized by the board under
- 16 Section 301.358, prescribing, ordering, procuring, administering,
- 17 and dispensing drugs and devices, including blood and blood
- 18 products, controlled substances listed in Schedules II, III, IV,
- 19 and V, dangerous drugs, and nonprescription drugs;
- 20 (6) providing referrals to health care agencies,
- 21 health care providers, and community resources;
- 22 (7) serving as the primary care provider of record;
- 23 <u>and</u>
- 24 (8) performing other acts that require education and
- 25 training consistent with professional standards and that are
- 26 commensurate with the advanced practice registered nurse's
- 27 education, licensure, and demonstrated competencies and

- 1 <u>experience.</u>
- 2 (e) An advanced practice registered nurse authorized to
- 3 practice under this section shall practice as a licensed
- 4 independent practitioner in accordance with standards established
- 5 and recognized by the board to protect the public health and safety.
- 6 (f) An advanced practice registered nurse authorized to
- 7 practice under this section is accountable to patients, the nursing
- 8 profession, and the board for:
- 9 (1) complying with the requirements of this chapter;
- 10 (2) providing quality advanced nursing care;
- 11 (3) recognizing the nurse's limits of knowledge;
- 12 (4) planning for the management of situations beyond
- 13 the nurse's expertise; and
- 14 (5) consulting with or referring patients to other
- 15 health care providers as appropriate.
- 16 (g) This section does not limit or modify the scope of
- 17 practice of a nurse who is not authorized to practice under this
- 18 section.
- 19 (h) The board by rule shall establish:
- 20 (1) the application process for authorization to
- 21 practice under this section; and
- 22 (2) a requirement that an advanced practice registered
- 23 nurse authorized to practice under this section complete at least
- 24 48 hours of continuing education, including 10 hours of continuing
- 25 education in pharmacology, every two years.
- 26 (i) Notwithstanding any other law, an advanced practice
- 27 registered nurse authorized to practice under this section who is

- 1 performing an act described by Subsection (d) is not considered to
- 2 be practicing medicine without a license.
- 3 Sec. 301.358. PRESCRIBING AND ORDERING AUTHORITY OF
- 4 ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSE. (a) The board may authorize an
- 5 advanced practice registered nurse authorized to practice by the
- 6 board under Section 301.357 to prescribe and order drugs and
- 7 devices, including controlled substances listed in Schedules III,
- 8 IV, and V, dangerous drugs, and nonprescription drugs.
- 9 (b) The board may authorize an advanced practice registered
- 10 nurse authorized to practice by the board under Section 301.357 to
- 11 prescribe and order controlled substances listed in Schedule II
- 12 only:
- 13 (1) in a hospital facility-based practice in
- 14 accordance with policies approved by the hospital's medical staff
- or a committee of the hospital's medical staff as provided by the
- 16 hospital bylaws to ensure patient safety and as part of the care
- 17 provided to a patient who:
- 18 (A) has been admitted to the hospital and is
- 19 expected to remain in the hospital for a period of 24 hours or more;
- 20 or
- 21 (B) is receiving services in the emergency
- 22 <u>department of the hospital; or</u>
- 23 (2) as part of the plan of care for the treatment of a
- 24 person who has executed a written certification of a terminal
- 25 illness, has elected to receive hospice care, and is receiving
- 26 hospice treatment from a qualified hospice provider.
