S.B. No. 964

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the appearance of a personal identification certificate or driver's license issued to a person who is not a citizen of the United States.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 521, Transportation Code, is amended by adding Section 521.1017 to read as follows:

Sec. 521.1017. DESIGNATOR ON CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO NONCITIZEN. A personal identification certificate issued to a person who is not a citizen of the United States must:

(1) orient the information on the certificate to clearly distinguish the certificate from a personal identification certificate issued to a person who is a citizen; and

(2) display the phrase "NOT ELIGIBLE TO VOTE" on the front of the certificate in the same font size as the individual's personal identification certificate number.

SECTION 2. Subchapter F, Chapter 521, Transportation Code, is amended by adding Section 521.1231 to read as follows:

Sec. 521.1231. DESIGNATOR ON LICENSE ISSUED TO NONCITIZEN. A driver's license issued to an applicant who is not a citizen of the United States must:

(1) orient the information on the license vertically, regardless of the age of the applicant, to clearly distinguish the license from a driver's license issued to a person who is a citizen;

2 (2) display the phrase "NOT ELIGIBLE TO VOTE" on the
3 front of the license in the same font size as the individual's
4 driver's license number.

5 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
6 a personal identification certificate or driver's license issued or
7 renewed on or after the effective date of this Act. A personal
8 identification certificate or driver's license issued or renewed
9 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in
10 effect when the license or certificate was issued or renewed, and
11 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

12 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
