6	SECTION 1. Section 223.208, Transportation Code, is amended
7	by adding Subsections (i), (j), and (k) to read as follows:
8	(i) Notwithstanding Subsection (h), the department shall
9	amend a comprehensive development agreement entered into on or
10	before March 22, 2007, for State Highway 130 from U.S. Highway 183
11	to Interstate Highway 10 (Segments 5 and 6) to extend the term of
12	the agreement for up to 20 additional years if the amendment:
13	(1) outlines the public benefit to be derived from
14	extending the term; and
15	(2) requires the private participant to provide
16	consideration in the manner or amount agreed to by the department
17	and the private participant in accordance with the requirements of
18	the amendment.
19	(j) Any funds received under Subsection (i)(2) must be used
20	by the department, or on behalf of the department using the
21	department's procurement process, for the design, financing,
22	construction, maintenance, and operation of nontolled
23	transportation projects between Interstate Highway 35 and State

Highway 130 to be located wholly or partly in a county in which the

- 1 project that is the subject of the comprehensive development
- 2 agreement described by Subsection (i) is located. Each nontolled
- 3 transportation project under this subsection must be approved by
- 4 the county in which the project is located before the expenditure of
- 5 funds by the department or on the department's behalf.
- 6 (k) Not later than December 1, 2026, the department shall
- 7 report on the implementation of the amendment to the comprehensive
- 8 development agreement described by Subsection (i) to the presiding
- 9 officer of each standing committee of the legislature with primary
- 10 jurisdiction over the department. This subsection expires
- 11 <u>September 1, 2027.</u>
- 12 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
