19	[(2) caused serious bodily injury to the applicant or

21	[(3) was the subject of two or more previous
22	protective orders rendered:
23	[(A) to protect the person on whose behalf the

[(B) after a finding by the court that the subject of the protective order has committed family violence].

SECTION 2. Section 85.001(d), Family Code, is repealed.

SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only to a protective order rendered on or after the effective date of this Act. A protective order rendered before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the order is

rendered, and the former law is continued in effect for that
