- SECTION 2. Subchapter G, Chapter 203, Occupations Code, is

- 8 SECTION 3. Subchapter H, Chapter 203, Occupations Code, is
- 9 amended by adding Section 203.3525 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 203.3525. ADMINISTRATION OF CERTAIN DRUGS. (a) A
- 11 <u>midwife may administer:</u>
- (1) a drug commonly used in labor or postpartum care,
- 13 including an antihemorrhagic drug, intravenous fluids, or a local
- 14 anesthetic; or
- 15 (2) a prophylactic drug that meets the applicable
- 16 standard of care for a woman or newborn.
- 17 (b) The administration of a drug by a midwife under this
- 18 section does not constitute the practice of medicine as defined by
- 19 Subtitle B.
- SECTION 4. Section 203.401, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 21 read as follows:
- Sec. 203.401. PROHIBITED PRACTICES. A midwife may not:
- 23 (1) provide midwifery care in violation of commission
- 24 rule, except in an emergency that poses an immediate threat to the
- 25 life of a woman or newborn;
- 26 (2) administer a prescription drug to a client other
- 27 than:

- 1 (A) a drug administered under the supervision of
- 2 a licensed physician in accordance with state law;
- 3 (B) prophylaxis approved by the Department of
- 4 State Health Services to prevent ophthalmia neonatorum; [or]
- 5 (C) oxygen administered in accordance with
- 6 commission rule; or
- 7 (D) a drug described by Section 203.3525;
- 8 (3) use forceps or a surgical instrument for a
- 9 procedure other than cutting the umbilical cord or providing
- 10 emergency first aid during delivery;
- 11 (4) remove placenta by invasive techniques;
- 12 (5) use a mechanical device or medicine to advance or
- 13 retard labor or delivery; or
- 14 (6) make on a birth certificate a false statement or
- 15 false record in violation of Section 195.003, Health and Safety
- 16 Code.
- 17 SECTION 5. Not later than December 1, 2025, the Texas
- 18 Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall adopt rules as
- 19 required by Section 203.302, Occupations Code, as added by this
- 20 Act.
- 21 SECTION 6. Section 203.302, Occupations Code, as added by
- 22 this Act, applies only to the renewal of a midwife license on or
- 23 after February 1, 2026. The renewal of a license before February 1,
- 24 2026, is governed by the law in effect immediately before the
- 25 effective date of this Act, and the former law is continued in
- 26 effect for that purpose.
- 27 SECTION 7. Section 203.401, Occupations Code, as amended by

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- 1 this Act, applies only to conduct that occurs on or after February
- 2 1, 2026. Conduct that occurs before February 1, 2026, is governed
- 3 by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this
- 4 Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 5 SECTION 8. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this
- 6 section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
- 7 (b) Section 203.256, Occupations Code, as amended by this
- 8 Act, and Section 203.3525, Occupations Code, as added by this Act,
- 9 take effect February 1, 2026.
