## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

S.B. No. 1114

1 AN ACT 2 relating to eligibility for the Lone Star Workforce of the Future 3 Fund grant program. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Section 134A.001, Education Code, is amended by adding Subdivision (3) to read as follows: 6 7 (3) "Qualifying general academic teaching institution" means a general academic teaching institution as 8 9 defined by Section 61.003 that: 10 (A) has a student enrollment of less than 10,000; 11 (B) is located in a county with a population of 12 less than 35,000; and 13 (C) is designated by the United States Department 14 of Education as a Minority Serving Institution (MSI). SECTION 2. Section 134A.006, Education Code, is amended to 15 16 read as follows:

Sec. 134A.006. LONE STAR WORKFORCE OF THE FUTURE FUND GRANT 17 PROGRAM. The commission shall establish and administer the Lone 18

Star Workforce of the Future Fund grant program to provide grants to 19

- 2 SECTION 3. Section 134A.007, Education Code, is amended to
- 3 read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 134A.007. GRANT ELIGIBILITY. To be eligible to
- 5 receive a grant under this chapter, a public junior college, public
- 6 technical institute, qualifying general academic teaching
- 7 <u>institution</u>, or nonprofit organization must:
- 8 (1) administer one or more performance-based
- 9 workforce training programs that:
- 10 (A) lead to skill development and experiences
- 11 required for employment in high demand occupations in at least one
- 12 career field identified and listed as a high-growth career field
- 13 by:
- 14 (i) the commission;
- 15 (ii) the Texas Workforce Investment
- 16 Council; or
- 17 (iii) the Tri-Agency Workforce Initiative
- 18 established under Chapter 2308A, Government Code;
- 19 (B) are developed and provided based on
- 20 consultation with and input from employers who are hiring in high
- 21 demand occupations;
- (C) create pathways to employment for program
- 23 participants; and
- (D) are delivered through classroom-based or
- 25 online instruction, work-based experiences internships, or
- 26 apprenticeships, or through a combination of those methods;
- 27 (2) demonstrate through third-party validated data

- 1 successful outcomes in:
- 2 (A) recruiting local unemployed and
- 3 underemployed individuals to participate in the training program or
- 4 programs;
- 5 (B) training individuals with the skills needed
- 6 to secure full-time employment paying at least a self-sufficient
- 7 wage as determined under Section 2308A.012, Government Code, in the
- 8 relevant job field; and
- 9 (C) placing individuals in employment in high
- 10 demand occupations;
- 11 (3) demonstrate the ability to attract at least 40
- 12 percent of the necessary funding for training program operation
- 13 from revenue streams other than state government funding; and
- 14 (4) agree to:
- 15 (A) collaborate with the commission, corporate
- 16 partners, and nonprofit educational partners to determine the
- 17 training programs to be provided using grant money;
- 18 (B) secure support from local businesses to
- 19 ensure alignment between training program offerings and in-demand
- 20 skills;
- 21 (C) collaborate with regional employers, public
- 22 junior colleges, public technical institutes, <u>qualifying general</u>
- 23 <u>academic teaching institutions</u>, or nonprofit organizations to make
- 24 available developmental work-based experiences to further enhance
- 25 training program participants' career readiness;
- 26 (D) engage local entities and organizations,
- 27 including local workforce development boards and community-based

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- 1 organizations, to assist with identifying and recruiting eligible
- 2 training program participants;
- 3 (E) provide documentation to the commission
- 4 describing training program offerings, including information
- 5 necessary to verify that the offerings will:
- 6 (i) provide training that is not exclusive
- 7 to a single corporate partner; and
- 8 (ii) lead to knowledge, skills, and
- 9 work-based experiences that are transferable to similar employment
- 10 opportunities in high demand occupations offered by other
- 11 employers; and
- 12 (F) comply with any additional grant conditions
- 13 prescribed by commission rule, including performance benchmarks
- 14 established under Section 134A.008 and reporting requirements
- 15 established under Section 134A.009.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
