## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- relating to the regulation of child welfare, including licensure, 2
- 3 community-based care contractors, family homes, and child-care
- 4 facilities.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5
- SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 42, Human Resources Code, 6
- 7 is amended by adding Section 42.0413 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 42.0413. EXEMPTION FOR SINGLE SOURCE CONTINUUM
- CONTRACTORS. (a) In this section, "contractor" means a "single 9
- source continuum <a href="contractor">contractor</a>, " which is contracted by the department 10
- to provide community-based care, including the management and 11
- oversight of foster care and other child welfare services, 12
- consistent with the plan described by Section 264.153, Family Code. 13
- (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, a 14
- contractor is not required to obtain a child-placing agency license 15
- for the purpose of fulfilling its contractual obligations to the 16
- 17 department.
- (c) The exemption under Subsection (b) does not relieve a 18
- contractor from compliance with other applicable laws, rules, or 19
- regulations governing the provision of foster care, adoption 20
- services, or other child welfare services, including requirements 21
- to ensure the health, safety, and well-being of children in its 22
- 23 care.
- 24 (d) Nothing in this section may be construed to exempt any

- 1 subcontractor or child-placing agency working under a contractor
- 2 from the applicable licensing requirements under this chapter.
- 3 (e) A contractor may choose to obtain a child-placing agency
- 4 <u>license under this chapter if it determi</u>nes that obtaining such a
- 5 license would facilitate the performance of its contractual
- 6 obligations or provide additional operational flexibility.
- 7 Obtaining a license is not a requirement for a contractor to fulfill
- 8 its duties under this section.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 42.043(b), Human Resources Code, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 (b) The department shall require that each child at an
- 12 appropriate age [have a test for tuberculosis and] be immunized
- 13 against diphtheria, tetanus, poliomyelitis, mumps, rubella,
- 14 rubeola, invasive pneumococcal disease, and hepatitis A and against
- 15 any other communicable disease as recommended by the Department of
- 16 State Health Services. The immunization must be effective on the
- 17 date of first entry into the facility. However, a child may be
- 18 provisionally admitted if the required immunizations have begun and
- 19 are completed as rapidly as medically feasible.
- SECTION 3. Section 42.049(a), Human Resources Code, is
- 21 amended to read as follows:
- 22 (a) A license or registration holder under this chapter
- 23 shall maintain liability insurance coverage in the amount of
- 24 \$100,000 [\$300,000] for each occurrence of negligence. An
- 25 insurance policy or contract required under this section must cover
- 26 injury to a child that occurs while the child is on the premises of
- 27 or in the care of the holder.

- 1 SECTION 4. Section 42.0495, Human Resources Code, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 42.0495. LIABILITY INSURANCE REQUIRED FOR LISTED
- 4 FAMILY HOMES. (a) A listed family home shall maintain liability
- 5 insurance coverage in the amount of \$100,000 [\$300,000] for each
- 6 occurrence of negligence. An insurance policy or contract required
- 7 under this section must cover injury to a child that occurs while
- 8 the child is on the premises of or in the care of the listed family
- 9 home.
- 10 (b) [A listed family home shall annually file with the
- 11 commission a certificate or other evidence of coverage from an
- 12 insurance company demonstrating that the listed family home has an
- 13 unexpired and uncanceled insurance policy or contract that meets
- 14 the requirements of this section.
- 15  $\left[\frac{(c)}{c}\right]$  If a listed family home is unable to secure a policy or
- 16 contract required under this section for financial reasons or for
- 17 lack of availability of an underwriter willing to issue a policy or
- 18 contract or the home's policy or contract limits are exhausted, the
- 19 home shall timely provide written notice to the parent or guardian
- 20 of each child attending the home that the liability coverage is not
- 21 provided.
- 22 <u>(c)</u> [<del>(d)</del>] A listed family home described by Subsection <u>(b)</u>
- 23  $[\frac{(c)}{c}]$  shall timely provide written notice to the commission that
- 24 the home is unable to secure liability insurance and the reason the
- 25 insurance could not be secured.
- (d)  $[\frac{(e)}{(e)}]$  If a listed family home complies with the notice
- 27 requirements under this section, the commission may not assess an

- 1 administrative penalty or suspend or revoke the family home's
- 2 listing for violating Subsection (a). This subsection may not be
- 3 construed to indemnify a family home for damages due to negligence.
- 4 SECTION 5. Section 42.051(b), Human Resources Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (b) An initial license is valid for  $\underline{12}$  [ $\underline{six}$ ] months from the
- 7 date it is issued and may be renewed for an additional six months.
- 8 SECTION 6. Section 42.068, Human Resources Code, is amended 9 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 42.068. REQUIRED POSTING OF NO TRESPASSING NOTICE;
- 11 CRIMINAL PENALTY. (a) Each general residential operation
- 12 operating as a residential treatment center shall post "No
- 13 Trespassing" notices on the grounds of the general residential
- 14 operation [in the following locations:
- 15 [(1) parallel to and along the exterior boundaries of
- 16 the general residential operation's grounds;
- 17 [(2) at each roadway or other way of access to the
- 18 grounds;
- 19 [(3) for grounds not fenced, at least every five
- 20 hundred feet along the exterior boundaries of the grounds;
- 21 [(4) at each entrance to the grounds; and
- [(5) at conspicuous places reasonably likely to be
- 23 <u>viewed by intruders</u>].
- 24 (b) [Each "No Trespassing" notice posted on the grounds of a
- 25 general residential operation operating as a residential treatment
- 26 center must:
- [(1) state that entry to the property is forbidden;

- 1 [(2) include a description of the provisions of
- 2 Section 30.05, Penal Code, including the penalties for violating
- 3 Section 30.05, Penal Code;
- 4 [(3) include the name and address of the person under
- 5 whose authority the notice is posted;
- 6 [(4) be written in English and Spanish; and
- 7 [(5) be at least 8-1/2 by 11 inches in size.
- 8 [<del>(c)</del>] The executive commissioner by rule shall determine and
- 9 prescribe the requirements regarding the placement, installation,
- 10 design, size, wording, and maintenance procedures for the "No
- 11 Trespassing" notices.
- 12 (c) [<del>(d)</del>] The commission shall provide without charge to
- 13 each general residential operation operating as a residential
- 14 treatment center the number of "No Trespassing" notices required to
- 15 comply with this section and rules adopted under this section.
- 16  $\underline{\text{(d)}}$  [ $\frac{\text{(e)}}{\text{)}}$ ] A person who operates a general residential
- 17 operation operating as a residential treatment center commits an
- 18 offense if the commission provides "No Trespassing" notices to the
- 19 facility and the person fails to display the "No Trespassing"
- 20 notices on the operation's grounds as required by this section
- 21 before the end of the 30th business day after the date the operation
- 22 receives the notices. An offense under this subsection is a Class C
- 23 misdemeanor.
- SECTION 7. Sections 43.004(a) and (b), Human Resources
- 25 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 26 (a) To be eligible for a child-care administrator's license
- 27 a person must:

- 1 (1) provide information for the department's use in 2 conducting a criminal history and background check under Subsection
- 3 (c), including a complete set of the person's fingerprints;
- 4 (2) satisfy the minimum requirements under department
- 5 rules relating to criminal history and background checks;
- 6 (3) pass an examination developed and administered by
- 7 the department that demonstrates competence in the field of
- 8 child-care administration; and
- 9 (4) have an experiential or educational equivalent to
- 10 that of a bachelor's degree in social work, child development, or a
- 11 <u>similar</u> [<del>one year of full-time experience in management or</del>
- 12 supervision of child-care personnel and programs; and
- 13 [(5) have one of the following educational and
- 14 experience qualifications:
- 15 [(A) a master's or doctoral degree in social work
- 16 or other area of study; or
- 17 [(B) a bachelor's degree and two years' full-time
- 18 experience in child care or a closely related] field.
- 19 (b) To be eligible for a child-placing agency
- 20 administrator's license a person must:
- 21 (1) provide information for the department's use in
- 22 conducting a criminal history and background check under Subsection
- 23 (c), including a complete set of the person's fingerprints;
- 24 (2) satisfy the minimum requirements under department
- 25 rules relating to criminal history and background checks;
- 26 (3) pass an examination developed and administered by
- 27 the department that demonstrates competence in the field of placing

- 1 children in residential settings or adoptive homes; and
- 2 (4) have an experiential or educational equivalent to
- 3 that of a bachelor's degree in social work, child development, or a
- 4 <u>similar</u> [one year of full-time experience in management or
- 5 supervision of child-placing personnel and programs; and
- 6 [(5) have one of the following educational and
- 7 experience qualifications:
- 8 [(A) a master's or doctoral degree in social work
- 9 or other area of study; or
- 10 [(B) a bachelor's degree and two years' full-time
- 11 experience in the field of placing children in residential settings
- 12 or adoptive homes or a closely related] field.
- SECTION 8. Section 43.009(e), Human Resources Code, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 (e) If a person's license has been expired for longer than
- 16 90 days but less than one year, the person may renew the license by
- 17 paying to the department one and one-half [two] times the required
- 18 renewal fee.
- 19 SECTION 9. Section 42.0431(b), Human Resources Code, is
- 20 repealed.
- 21 SECTION 10. (a) The commissioner of the Department of
- 22 Family and Protective Services shall adopt rules necessary to
- 23 implement the changes in law made by this Act not later than
- 24 December 1, 2025.
- 25 (b) The rules adopted to implement Section 42.0413, Human
- 26 Resources Code, as added by this Act, must ensure that single source
- 27 continuum contractors operate in a manner that continues to

- 1 prioritize the safety and well-being of children in the foster care
- 2 system.
- 3 SECTION 11. (a) Sections 3 and 4 of this Act take effect
- 4 January 1, 2026.
- 5 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (a) of this section,
- 6 this Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
