2	relating to standard permits for certain concrete plants.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 382.05195, Health and Safety Code, is
5	amended by amending Subsection (k) and adding Subsection (l) to
6	read as follows:
7	(k) An application for <u>an authorization to use</u> [the issuance
8	$\frac{\mathrm{of}}{\mathrm{of}}$] a standard permit under this section for a concrete plant that
9	performs wet batching, dry batching, or central mixing, including a
10	permanent, temporary, or specialty concrete batch plant, as defined
11	by the commission, must include:
12	(1) a statement of the proposed daily hours of
13	<pre>operation for:</pre>
14	(A) the facility; and
15	(B) vehicles associated with transporting
16	material to or from the facility; and
17	(2) a plot plan that clearly shows:
18	(A) [(1)] a distance scale;
19	(B) $\left[\frac{(2)}{(2)}\right]$ a north arrow;
20	(C) $[(3)]$ all property lines, emission points,
21	buildings, tanks, and process vessels and other process equipment
22	in the area in which the facility will be located;
23	(D) $[(4)]$ at least two benchmark locations in the
24	area in which the facility will be located; and

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- 1 $\underline{\text{(E)}}$ [(5)] if the permit requires a distance,
- 2 setback, or buffer from other property or structures as a condition
- 3 of the permit, whether the required distance or setback will be met.
- 4 (1) A standard permit described by Subsection (k):
- 5 (1) must require that, unless the executive director
- 6 provides otherwise in the authorization to use the standard permit:
- 7 (A) the facility operate only after 7:00 a.m. and
- 8 before 7:00 p.m.; and
- 9 (B) at the facility site, vehicles transport
- 10 material used in the production of concrete only after 5:00 a.m. and
- 11 before 9:00 p.m.;
- 12 (2) may allow the executive director to include in the
- 13 authorization to use the standard permit alternative operating
- 14 hours for the facility for use during not more than five days per
- 15 <u>calendar year to accommodate special circumstances;</u>
- 16 (3) must allow the appropriate commission regional
- 17 office to authorize temporary alternative operating hours for the
- 18 facility in response to a disaster or other emergency; and
- 19 (4) must require that records be maintained on site
- 20 that show the use of alternative operating hours authorized under
- 21 <u>Subdivision (2) or (3).</u>
- 22 SECTION 2. Section 382.051985, Health and Safety Code, is
- 23 amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 24 (c) Section 382.05195(1) does not apply to a plant permitted
- 25 under this section.
- 26 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
