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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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1	AN ACT
2	relating to establishing the Higher Education Research Security
3	Council.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 51, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 51.957 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 51.957. HIGHER EDUCATION RESEARCH SECURITY COUNCIL.
8	(a) In this section:
9	(1) "Council" means the Higher Education Research
10	Security Council established under this section.
11	(2) "Postsecondary educational institution" means an
12	institution of higher education or a private or independent
13	institution of higher education, as those terms are defined by
14	<u>Section 61.003.</u>
15	(3) "Tier one research institution" means a
16	postsecondary educational institution in this state designated as
17	R1: very high spending and doctorate production in the 2025
18	Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education
19	published by the Indiana University Center for Postsecondary
20	Research.
21	(b) The Higher Education Research Security Council is
22	established to promote secure academic research at tier one
23	research institutions while mitigating the risk of foreign
24	espionage and interference.

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1	(c) The council is composed of:
2	(1) each research security officer designated under
3	Section 51.956; and
4	(2) a research security officer designated by each
5	private or independent institution of higher education, as defined
6	by Section 61.003, that elects to participate in the council.
7	(d) A council member serves at the will of the person who
8	designated the member.
9	(e) A vacancy on the council shall be filled in the same
10	manner as the original designation.
11	(f) The council member designated under Section 51.956 for
12	The Texas A&M University System shall serve as the initial
13	presiding officer of the council.
14	(g) The council shall:
15	(1) identify best practices for a tier one research
16	institution to conduct research securely while mitigating the
17	threat of foreign espionage and interference;
18	(2) develop a research security policy that a tier one
19	research institution shall adopt to improve research security;
20	(3) establish an accreditation process under which the
21	council shall award a tier one research institution an
22	accreditation for security excellence;
23	(4) promote attendance at the annual academic security
24	and counter exploitation program seminar offered by The Texas A&M
25	University System; and
26	(5) develop and offer an annual training program for
27	tier one research institution security officers that includes:

(h) The council shall meet at least once each quarter. 6 7 (i) A meeting conducted under Subsection (h) must be in person or by video conference call, as determined by the presiding 8 9 officer. 10 (j) The council shall prepare and submit to the governor, 11 the attorney general's office, and the presiding officer of each legislative committee with primary jurisdiction over higher 12 13 education an annual report on the status of research security at 14 tier one research institutions and any associated recommendations. 15 (k) A report submitted under Subsection (j) is confidential and is not subject to disclosure under Chapter 552, Government 16 17 Code. (1) The council may solicit and accept gifts, grants, and 18 donations for purposes of this section but may not solicit or accept 19 20 a gift, grant, or donation from an entity or country: (1) prohibited from participating in federal 21 contracts under Section 889, John S. McCain National Defense 22 23 Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019 (Pub. L. No. 115-232); (2) identified as a Chinese military company by the 24 25 United States Department of Defense in accordance with Section 1260H, William M. (Mac) Thornberry National Defense Authorization 26 27 Act for Fiscal Year 2021 (Pub. L. No. 116-283);

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1	(3) owned by the government of a country designated as
2	a foreign adversary by the United States secretary of commerce
3	under 15 C.F.R. Section 791.4; or
4	(4) controlled by a governing or regulatory body
5	located in a country described by Subdivision (3).
6	SECTION 2. (a) Not later than October 1, 2025, the
7	appropriate entities shall designate the members of the Higher
8	Education Research Security Council established under Section
9	51.957, Education Code, as added by this Act.
10	(b) Not later than January 1, 2026, the Higher Education
11	Research Security Council established under Section 51.957,
12	Education Code, as added by this Act, shall hold its initial
13	meeting.
14	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
