## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to establishing the Higher Education Research Security 3 Council. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 51, Education Code, is amended by adding Section 51.957 to read as follows: 6 7 Sec. 51.957. HIGHER EDUCATION RESEARCH SECURITY COUNCIL. (a) In this section: 8 9 (1) "Council" means the Higher Education Research Security Council established under this section. 10 11 (2) "Postsecondary educational institution" means an 12 institution of higher education or a private or independent institution of higher education, as those terms are defined by 13 14 Section 61.003. 15 (3) "Tier one research institution" means a 16 postsecondary educational institution designated as R1: very high spending and doctorate production in the 2025 Carnegie 17 Classification of Institutions of Higher Education published by the 18 Indiana University Center for Postsecondary Research. 19 (b) The Higher Education Research Security Council is 20 established to promote secure academic research at tier one 21 research institutions while mitigating the risk of foreign 22 23 espionage and interference. 24 (c) The council is composed of each research security

1 officer designated under Section 51.956. 2 (d) A council member serves at the will of the person who 3 designated the member. 4 (e) A vacancy on the council shall be filled in the same 5 manner as the original designation. 6 (f) The council member designated under Section 51.956 for 7 The Texas A&M University System shall serve as the initial 8 presiding officer of the council. 9 (g) The council shall: (1) identify best practices for a tier one research 10 institution to conduct research securely while mitigating the 11 12 threat of foreign espionage and interference; (2) develop a research security policy that a tier one 13 14 research institution may adopt to improve research security; 15 (3) establish an accreditation process under which the council may award a tier one research institution an accreditation 16 17 for security excellence; 18 (4) promote attendance at the annual academic security 19 and counter exploitation program seminar offered by The Texas A&M <u>Universi</u>ty System; and 20 21 (5) develop and offer an annual training program for tier one research institution security officers that includes: 22 (A) background and academic history checks of 23 24 researchers; and 25 (B) research security and integrity tools and 26 software that may be used to prevent the loss of intellectual 27 capital.

1	(h) The council shall meet at least once each quarter.
2	(i) A meeting conducted under Subsection (h) may be in
3	person or by video conference call, as determined by the presiding
4	officer.
5	(j) The council shall prepare and submit to the attorney
6	general's office and to the presiding officer of each legislative
7	committee with primary jurisdiction over higher education an annual
8	report on the status of research security at tier one research
9	institutions and any associated recommendations.
10	(k) A report submitted under Subsection (j) is confidential
11	and is not subject to disclosure under Chapter 552, Government
12	Code.
13	(1) The council may solicit and accept gifts, grants, and
14	donations for purposes of this section but may not solicit or accept
15	<u>a gift, grant, or donation from China, Iran, North Korea, Russia, or</u>
16	any other country designated as a country of particular concern in
17	the United States secretary of state's most recent designations
18	under the International Religious Freedom Act of 1998 (22 U.S.C.
19	Section 6401 et seq.).
20	SECTION 2. (a) Not later than October 1, 2025, the
21	appropriate entities shall designate the members of the Higher
22	Education Research Security Council established under Section

25 Research Security Council established under Section 51.957, 26 Education Code, as added by this Act, shall hold its initial 27 meeting.
