4	SECTION 1. Section 63.101, Parks and Wildlife Code, is
5	amended to read as follows:

- Sec. 63.101. PROTECTION OF BATS. (a) Except as provided by Subsections (b), (b-1), and (c), \underline{a} [no] person may not:
- 8 (1) <u>confine or</u> hunt a bat; or
- 9 (2) sell, offer for sale, purchase, offer to purchase, 10 or possess after purchase a bat or any part of a bat, dead or alive.
- (b) <u>Subject to Subsection (b-1), a</u> [A] bat may be removed or hunted if the bat is inside or on a building occupied by people.
- 13 (b-1) A bat or bat colony using a building or structure as a
 14 roost site may be controlled only by a nonlethal exclusion method
 15 that allows bats to leave but not reenter the building or structure.
 16 The exclusion method described by this subsection may not be
 17 implemented during the period each year beginning May 1 and ending
- 19 (c) This section does not apply to:
- (1) an animal control officer, a peace officer, <u>a</u>

 21 <u>licensed pest control professional</u>, or a health official who

 22 captures a bat that the officer, <u>professional</u>, or official

 23 considers injured or diseased; or
- 24 (2) a person who transports a bat for the purpose of:

- 1 (A) laboratory testing if the bat has exposed or
- 2 potentially exposed humans or domestic animals to rabies; or
- 3 (B) rehabilitation at a registered
- 4 rehabilitation facility if the bat has had no known prior exposure
- 5 <u>with humans</u>
- 6 [(3) a person who is licensed to provide pest control
- 7 services].
- 8 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
