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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the redesignation of the State Water Implementation Fund for Texas Advisory Committee as the Texas Water Fund Advisory 3 Committee, the abolition of the Texas Infrastructure Resiliency 4 5 Fund Advisory Committee, and the composition and functions of the Texas Water Fund Advisory Committee. 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 7 SECTION 1. Section 15.431(a)(1), Water Code, is amended to 8 read as follows: 9 (1) "Advisory committee" means the [State Water 10 11 Implementation Fund for] Texas Water Fund Advisory Committee. 12 SECTION 2. Section 15.438, Water Code, is transferred to Subchapter A, Chapter 15, Water Code, redesignated as Section 13 14 15.009, Water Code, and amended to read as follows: Sec. 15.009 [15.438]. TEXAS WATER FUND ADVISORY 15 COMMITTEE. (a) The [State Water Implementation Fund for] Texas 16 Water Fund Advisory Committee is composed of the following eight 17 [seven] members: 18 (1) the comptroller, or a person designated by the 19 20 comptroller; 21 (2) the chair of the committee of the senate having 22 primary jurisdiction over water resources; 23 (3) the chair of the committee of the house of 24 representatives having primary jurisdiction over water resources;

No. 1288 (4) two [three] members of the senate appointed by the 1 lieutenant governor, including <u>at least one</u>[+ 2 $\left[\frac{(\Lambda)}{a}\right]$ member of the committee of the senate 3 having primary jurisdiction over matters relating to finance; 4 5 (5) two [and 6 [(B) the chair of the committee of the senate 7 having primary jurisdiction over water resources; and 8 [(3) three] members of the house of representatives appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, including 9 10 at least one[+ $\left[\frac{(\Lambda)}{a}\right]$ member of the committee of the house of 11 12 representatives having primary jurisdiction over appropriations; 13 and 14 (6) the director of the Texas Division of Emergency 15 Management or the successor in function to that entity, or a person designated by that person, who serves as a nonvoting member 16 [(B) the chair of the committee of the house of 17 representatives having primary jurisdiction over water resources]. 18 19 (b) The following persons shall serve as staff support for the advisory committee: 20 21 (1)the deputy executive administrator of the board who is responsible for water science and conservation or a person 22 who holds an equivalent position at the agency, or a person 23 24 designated by that person; 25 (2) the deputy executive administrator of the board 26 who is responsible for water resources planning and information or a person who holds an equivalent position at the agency, or a person 27

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1 designated by that person; and

2 (3) the chief financial officer of the board, or a3 person who holds an equivalent position at the agency.

4 (c) <u>A</u> [<u>An appointed</u>] member of the advisory committee
5 <u>designated under Subsection (a)(1) or (6) or appointed under</u>
6 <u>Subsection (a)(4) or (5)</u> serves at the will of the person who
7 <u>designated or appointed the member.</u>

8 (d) The <u>members of the advisory committee described by</u> 9 <u>Subsections (a)(2) and (3) serve as</u> [lieutenant governor shall 10 appoint a] co-presiding <u>officers</u> [officer] of the [advisory] 11 committee [from among the members appointed by the lieutenant 12 governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives shall 13 appoint a co-presiding officer of the committee from among the 14 members appointed by the speaker].

15 (e) The advisory committee may hold public hearings, formal 16 meetings, or work sessions. Either co-presiding officer of the 17 advisory committee may call a public hearing, formal meeting, or 18 work session of the advisory committee at any time. The advisory 19 committee may not take formal action at a public hearing, formal 20 meeting, or work session unless a quorum of the committee is 21 present.

(f) Except as otherwise provided by this subsection, a member of the advisory committee is not entitled to receive compensation for service on the committee or reimbursement for expenses incurred in the performance of official duties as a member of the committee. Service on the advisory committee by a member of the senate or house of representatives is considered legislative

1 service for which the member is entitled to reimbursement and other
2 benefits in the same manner and to the same extent as for other
3 legislative service.

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4 (g) <u>As needed, the</u> [The] advisory committee shall submit
5 comments and recommendations to the board regarding the use of
6 money in:

7 (1) the <u>state water implementation fund for Texas</u> 8 <u>established under Subchapter G</u> [fund] for use by the board in 9 adopting rules under Section 15.439 and in adopting policies and 10 procedures under Section 15.441;

11 (2) the Texas water fund established under Subchapter
12 H-1 for use by the board in adopting rules under Section 15.507;

13 (3) the flood infrastructure fund established under 14 Subchapter I for use by the board in adopting rules under Section 15 15.537; and

16 (4) the Texas infrastructure resiliency fund 17 established under Section 16.452 for use by the board in adopting 18 rules under Section 16.460. [The submission must include:

19 [(1) comments and recommendations on rulemaking 20 related to the prioritization of projects in regional water plans 21 and the state water plan in accordance with Section 15.437;

22 [(2) comments and recommendations on rulemaking 23 related to establishing standards for determining whether projects 24 meet the criteria provided by Section 15.434(b);

25 [(3) an evaluation of the available programs for 26 providing financing for projects included in the state water plan 27 and guidelines for implementing those programs, including

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1	guidelines for providing financing for projects included in the
2	state water plan that are authorized under Subchapter Q or R of this
3	chapter, Subchapter E or F, Chapter 16, or Subchapter J, Chapter 17;
4	[(1) an evaluation of the lending practices of the
5	board and guidelines for lending standards;
6	[(5) an evaluation of the use of funds by the board to
7	provide support for financial assistance for water projects,
8	including support for the purposes described by Section 15.435(c);
9	[(6) an evaluation of whether premium financing
10	programs should be established within the funds described by
11	Section 15.435 to serve the purposes of this subchapter, especially
12	in connection with projects described by Section 15.434(b);
13	[(7) an evaluation of methods for encouraging
14	participation in the procurement process by companies domiciled in
15	this state or that employ a significant number of residents of this
16	state; and
17	[(8) an evaluation of the overall operation, function,
18	and structure of the fund.]
19	(h) The advisory committee shall review the overall
20	operation, function, and structure of each fund listed in
21	Subsection (g) [the fund] at least semiannually [and may provide
22	comments and recommendations to the board on any matter].
23	(i) The advisory committee may <u>:</u>
24	(1) provide comments and recommendations to the board
25	on any matter;
26	(2) review the overall operation, function, and
27	structure of any fund established under this chapter or Chapter 16

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1 that is not listed in Subsection (g); and

2 <u>(3)</u> adopt rules, procedures, and policies as needed to 3 administer this section and implement its responsibilities.

4 (j) Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to the 5 size, composition, or duration of the advisory committee.

6 (k) The advisory committee is subject to Chapter 325, 7 Government Code (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence 8 as provided by that chapter, the advisory committee is abolished 9 and this section expires September 1, 2035.

10 (1) <u>As needed, the</u> [The] advisory committee shall make 11 recommendations to the board regarding information to be posted on 12 the board's Internet website <u>relating to the funds listed in</u> 13 <u>Subsection (g)</u> [under Section 15.440(b)].

14 (m) The advisory committee shall evaluate and may provide 15 comments or recommendations on the feasibility of the state owning, constructing, and operating water supply projects, including 16 17 reservoirs and major water supply conveyance infrastructure, through existing financial assistance programs under Subchapter E 18 of this chapter, Subchapter E or F, Chapter 16, or other mechanisms. 19 The executive administrator shall provide an annual 20 (n) report to the advisory committee on: 21

(1) the board's compliance with statewide annual goals
relating to historically underutilized businesses; and

(2) the participation level of historically
underutilized businesses in projects that receive funding related
to a bond enhancement agreement under <u>Subchapter G</u> [this
subchapter].

(o) If the aggregate level of participation by historically
underutilized businesses in projects that receive funding related
to a bond enhancement agreement under <u>Subchapter G</u> [this
<u>subchapter</u>] does not meet statewide annual goals adopted under
Chapter 2161, Government Code, the advisory committee shall make
recommendations to the board to improve the participation level.
