- 4 to read as follows:

- 9 and municipal police officers who are selected to attend the

- 18 SECTION 3. Section 28.002, Education Code, as amended by
- 19 this Act, applies beginning with the 2025-2026 school year.
- 20 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
