9	(a) The department shall consult with the Health and Human Services		
10	Commission to develop a biennial reference guide designed to		
11	educate the public about health coverage in this state.		
12	(b) The reference guide must include the following		
13	information:		
14	(1) the biennial period covered by the current		
15	edition;		
16	(2) definitions of the term "health insurance" and		
17	terms used to describe other forms of health coverage;		
18	(3) sources from which consumers may obtain health		
19	coverage, including through employers, and an explanation of how		
20	coverage may be obtained from each of those sources;		
21	(4) a guide to consumer rights and resources related		
22	to health coverage;		
23	(5) a health coverage shopping guide that includes:		
24	(A) an explanation of discount cards and other

21	(7) a basic overview of federal, state, and local		
22	programs that may assist consumers to obtain health care services;		
23	(8) methods for a consumer to resolve disputes with a

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(10) the areas of health coverage regulated by the

- 4 (c) The department shall publish the reference guide
- 5 <u>developed under this section on the department's Internet website</u>
- 6 and in a printed form available to the public on request.
- 7 SECTION 2. The Texas Department of Insurance shall publish
- 8 the first biennial reference guide under Section 524A.001,
- 9 Insurance Code, as added by this Act, not later than January 1,
- 10 2026.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
