- (b-1) The commissioner of state health services or, if the 8
- 9 commissioner is not a physician, the chief medical executive of the
- Department of State Health Services may issue a statewide standing 10
- order prescribing medication for respiratory distress to a school 11
- district, open-enrollment charter school, or private school. 12
- (c) The standing order under Subsection (b) or (b-1) is not 13
- required to be patient-specific, and the epinephrine auto-injector 14
- or medication for respiratory distress may be administered to a 15

- 18 SECTION 2. Subchapter E, Chapter 38, Education Code, is
- amended by adding Section 38.2115 to read as follows: 19
- Sec. 38.2115. CONTRACTING FOR MEDICATION FOR RESPIRATORY 20
- DISTRESS AND TRAINING. The board of trustees of a school district 21
- or governing body of an open-enrollment charter school or private 22
- 23 school may contract with a vendor to provide:
- 24 (1) medication for respiratory distress and related

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- 1 equipment to the district or school; and
- 2 (2) training to school personnel and school volunteers
- 3 <u>authorized to administer medication for respiratory distress under</u>
- 4 this subchapter.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
