## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to requiring an occupational license to practice magnetic
3	resonance imaging physics.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 602.002, Occupations Code, is amended by
6	amending Subdivisions (5-a) and (12) and adding Subdivision (5-b)
7	to read as follows:
8	(5-a) "Magnetic resonance imaging physics" means the
9	branch of medical physics that deals with radiofrequency radiation
10	and the use of equipment associated with the production and use of
11	radiofrequency radiation.
12	(5-b) "Medical board" means the Texas Medical Board.
13	(12) "Radiological physics" means the branch of
14	medical physics that includes:
15	(A) diagnostic radiological physics;
16	(B) magnetic resonance imaging physics;
17	(C) medical health physics;
18	(D) [(C)] medical nuclear physics; and
19	$\underline{\text{(E)}}$ [ $\frac{\text{(D)}}{\text{)}}$ ] therapeutic radiological physics.
20	SECTION 2. Section 602.201(b), Occupations Code, is amended
21	to read as follows:
22	(b) A medical physicist may not practice the following
23	specialties unless the person holds a license for that specialty:
24	(1) diagnostic radiological physics;

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- 1 (2) magnetic resonance imaging physics; 2 (3) medical health physics; 3 (4) [(3)] medical nuclear physics; or 4 (5) [(4)] therapeutic radiological physics. 5 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act, the Texas Medical Board shall adopt rules necessary to 6 implement the changes in law made by this Act to Chapter 602, 7 Occupations Code. 8
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
