- 2 relating to school district police department accreditation,
- 3 including a grant program to assist departments in becoming
- 4 accredited.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 403, Government Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 403.0303 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 403.0303. SCHOOL DISTRICT POLICE DEPARTMENT
- 9 ACCREDITATION GRANT PROGRAM. (a) The comptroller shall establish
- 10 and administer a grant program to provide financial assistance to a
- 11 school district police department in this state for purposes of
- 12 becoming accredited as required by the rules adopted under Section
- 13 <u>1701.171</u>, Occupations Code.
- 14 (b) To be eligible to receive a grant under this section, a
- 15 school district police department must have executed a contract
- 16 with an accrediting entity described by Section 1701.171(a),
- 17 Occupations Code, and complete an initial assessment by the
- 18 accrediting entity.
- 19 <u>(c) Based on the results of the initial assessment completed</u>
- 20 under Subsection (b), a school district police department may
- 21 request grant funds for reimbursement of an accreditation fee,
- 22 staff overtime, or temporary staffing necessary to become
- 23 accredited.
- 24 (d) Grant money provided under this section may only be used

- 1 by a school district police department for the purposes of becoming
- 2 accredited. A school district police department may not receive
- 3 more than one grant under this section.
- 4 (e) The amount of a grant awarded under this section may not
- 5 exceed \$30,000.
- 6 (f) The comptroller shall establish:
- 7 (1) eligibility criteria for grant applicants;
- 8 (2) grant application procedures;
- 9 (3) guidelines relating to grant amounts;
- 10 (4) procedures for evaluating grant applications;
- 11 (5) procedures for monitoring the use of a grant
- 12 awarded under the program and ensuring compliance with any
- 13 conditions of a grant; and
- 14 (6) procedures for revoking a grant awarded under the
- 15 program if the school district police department is not accredited
- 16 within the period specified by the rules adopted under Section
- 17 1701.171, Occupations Code.
- 18 (g) Not later than December 1 of each year, the comptroller
- 19 shall submit to the Legislative Budget Board a report that provides
- 20 the following information for the preceding state fiscal year:
- 21 (1) the name of each school district police department
- 22 that applied for a grant under this section; and
- 23 (2) the amount of money distributed to each school
- 24 district police department that received a grant under this
- 25 section.
- 26 (h) The comptroller may use any revenue available for
- 27 purposes of this section.

- 1 (i) Notwithstanding any other law or rule, beginning
- 2 September 1, 2031, a school district police department must be
- 3 accredited as provided by the rules adopted under Section 1701.171,
- 4 Occupations Code, to be eligible to receive any grant supporting
- 5 law enforcement operations or equipment acquisition administered
- 6 by the comptroller other than a grant under this section.
- 7 SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Section 1701.171 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 1701.171. SCHOOL DISTRICT POLICE DEPARTMENT
- 10 ACCREDITATION. (a) The commission shall adopt rules requiring
- 11 each school district police department to become accredited and
- 12 maintain accreditation:
- 13 (1) through the Texas Police Chiefs Association Law
- 14 Enforcement Agency Best Practices Accreditation Program;
- 15 (2) by the Commission on Accreditation for Law
- 16 Enforcement Agencies, Inc.; or
- 17 (3) by an association or organization designated by
- 18 the commission as provided by Subsection (d).
- 19 (b) The rules adopted under Subsection (a) must require a
- 20 school district police department that is not already accredited
- 21 <u>to:</u>
- (1) execute a contract with an approved accrediting
- 23 entity not later than September 1, 2029; and
- 24 (2) become accredited not later than September 1,
- 25 2031.
- 26 (c) The commission shall implement a program to assist
- 27 school district police departments in becoming accredited as

- 1 required by the rules adopted under Subsection (a).
- 2 (d) The commission shall periodically review associations
- 3 and organizations that establish standards of practice for school
- 4 district police departments and that offer accreditation to
- 5 departments that meet those standards. On a majority vote of the
- 6 commission that accreditation of school district police
- 7 departments in this state by an association or organization would
- 8 benefit public safety, the commission may designate the association
- 9 or organization as an accrediting entity for purposes of Subsection
- 10 <u>(a)(3)</u>.
- 11 (e) A school district police department shall annually
- 12 report the department's accreditation status, including the
- 13 applicable accrediting entity described by Subsection (a), to the
- 14 commission.
- 15 <u>(f) The commission shall post on the commission's Internet</u>
- 16 website a list of all school district police departments that are
- 17 currently accredited by, or under contract with, an accrediting
- 18 entity described by Subsection (a).
- 19 SECTION 3. (a) Not later than December 1, 2025, the Texas
- 20 Commission on Law Enforcement shall adopt the rules required by
- 21 Section 1701.171, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
- (b) Not later than January 1, 2026, the comptroller shall
- 23 establish the grant program required by Section 403.0303,
- 24 Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 25 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

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- 1 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 2 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
