A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the text of ballot propositions for bond elections. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 1251, Government Code, as 4 5 added by Chapters 728 (H.B. 477) and 505 (S.B. 30), Acts of the 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019, is reenacted and amended to 6 7 read as follows: SUBCHAPTER B. BALLOT FOR DEBT OBLIGATIONS ISSUED BY POLITICAL 8 9 SUBDIVISION Sec. 1251.051. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: 10 11 (1)"Debt obligation" means a public security, as 12 defined by Section 1201.002, secured by and payable from ad valorem The term does not include public securities that are 13 taxes. 14 designated as self-supporting by the political subdivision issuing the securities. 15 "Debt obligation election order" means the order, 16 (2) 17 ordinance, or resolution ordering an election to authorize the issuance of debt obligations. 18 (3) "Political subdivision" means a municipality, 19 county, school district, or special taxing district. 20 21 Sec. 1251.052. FORM. (a) The ballot for a measure seeking voter approval of the issuance of debt obligations by a political 22 23 subdivision shall specifically [state]: 24 (1) state a general description of the single specific

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1 project [purposes] for which the debt obligations are to be
2 authorized;

3 (2) <u>list and clearly describe each structure or</u>
4 improvement included in the specific project for which the debt
5 obligations are to be authorized;

6 (3) state the total estimated cost of each structure 7 or improvement described by Subdivision (2);

8 <u>(4) state</u> the total principal amount of the debt 9 obligations to be authorized;

10 (5) include the statement "THIS IS A TAX INCREASE"; 11 and

12 (6) state [(3)] that taxes sufficient to pay the 13 principal of and interest on the debt obligations will be imposed.

14 (a-1) Each single specific <u>project</u> [purpose] for which debt 15 obligations requiring voter approval are to be issued must be 16 printed on the ballot as a separate proposition. A proposition may 17 include as a specific <u>project</u> [purpose] one or more structures or 18 improvements <u>at the same location</u> [serving the substantially same 19 <u>purpose</u>] and may include [related improvements and] equipment 20 necessary to accomplish the specific <u>project</u> [purpose].

(b) A political subdivision with at least 250 registered voters on the date the governing body of the political subdivision adopts the debt obligation election order must prepare a voter information document for each proposition to be voted on at the election. The political subdivision shall post the voter information document in the same manner as a debt obligation election order is required to be posted under Section 4.003(f),

S.B. No. 1389 1 Election Code, and may include the voter information document in the debt obligation election order. The voter information document 2 3 must distinctly state: the language that will appear on the ballot; 4 (1)5 the following information formatted as a table: (2) 6 the principal of the debt obligations to be (A) 7 authorized; 8 (B) the estimated interest for the debt obligations to be authorized; 9 10 (C) the estimated combined principal and 11 interest required to pay on time and in full the debt obligations to 12 be authorized; and as of the date the political subdivision 13 (D) 14 adopts the debt obligation election order: 15 (i) the principal of all outstanding debt 16 obligations of the political subdivision; 17 (ii) the estimated remaining interest on all outstanding debt obligations of the political subdivision, 18 19 which may be based on the political subdivision's expectations relative to the interest due on any variable rate debt obligations; 20 21 and (iii) the estimated combined principal and 22 interest required to pay on time and in full all outstanding debt 23 24 obligations of the political subdivision, which may be based on the political subdivision's expectations relative to the interest due 25 26 on any variable rate debt obligations; 27 (3) the estimated maximum annual increase in the

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1 amount of taxes that would be imposed on a residence homestead in 2 the political subdivision with an appraised value of \$100,000 to 3 repay the debt obligations to be authorized, if approved, based 4 upon assumptions made by the governing body of the political 5 subdivision; and

6 (4) any other information that the political 7 subdivision considers relevant or necessary to explain the 8 information required by this subsection.

9 (c) The governing body of the political subdivision shall 10 identify in the voter information document the major assumptions 11 made in connection with the statement required by Subsection 12 (b)(3), including:

(1) the amortization of the political subdivision's debt obligations, including outstanding debt obligations and the proposed debt obligations;

16 (2) changes in estimated future appraised values 17 within the political subdivision; and

18 (3) the assumed interest rate on the proposed debt19 obligations.

(d) A political subdivision that maintains an Internet website shall provide the information described by Subsection (b) on its website in an easily accessible manner beginning not later than the 21st day before election day and ending on the day after the date of the debt obligation election.

(e) This section provides the ballot proposition language
for an election to authorize the issuance of debt obligations by a
political subdivision. To the extent of a conflict between this

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1 section and another law, this section controls.

2 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 3 an election ordered on or after the effective date of this Act.

4 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
