A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to prohibiting the adoption or use of national sexuality education standards in public schools. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Sections 28.002(b-1), (b-2), and (b-4), Education Code, are amended to read as follows: 6 7 (b-1) In this section: (1) "Common[7 "common] core state standards" means the 8 9 national curriculum standards developed by the Common Core State Standards Initiative. 10 11 (2) "National sexuality education standards" means 12 the national standards developed by the Future of Sex Education 13 Initiative. 14 (b-2) The State Board of Education may not adopt common core state standards or national sexuality education standards to comply 15 16 with a duty imposed under this chapter. (b-4) Notwithstanding any other provision of this code, a 17 school district or open-enrollment charter school may not be 18 required to offer any aspect of a common core state standards 19 curriculum or any aspect of the national sexuality education 20 21 standards. 22 SECTION 2. Section 28.004(e), Education Code, is amended to 23 read as follows: 24 (e) Any course materials and instruction relating to human

1 sexuality, sexually transmitted diseases, or human 2 immunodeficiency virus or acquired immune deficiency syndrome 3 shall be selected by the board of trustees with the advice of the 4 local school health advisory council and:

5 <u>(1)</u> must:

6 <u>(A)</u> [(1)] present abstinence from sexual 7 activity as the preferred choice of behavior in relationship to all 8 sexual activity for unmarried persons of school age;

9 (B) [(2)] devote more attention to abstinence
10 from sexual activity than to any other behavior;

11 (C) [(3)] emphasize that abstinence from sexual 12 activity, if used consistently and correctly, is the only method 13 that is 100 percent effective in preventing pregnancy, sexually 14 transmitted diseases, infection with human immunodeficiency virus 15 or acquired immune deficiency syndrome, and the emotional trauma 16 associated with adolescent sexual activity;

17 <u>(D)</u> [(4)] direct adolescents to a standard of 18 behavior in which abstinence from sexual activity before marriage 19 is the most effective way to prevent pregnancy, sexually 20 transmitted diseases, and infection with human immunodeficiency 21 virus or acquired immune deficiency syndrome; and

(E) [(5)] teach contraception and condom use in terms of human use reality rates instead of theoretical laboratory rates, if instruction on contraception and condoms is included in curriculum content; and

26 (2) may not be based on national sexuality education 27 standards, as defined by Section 28.002(b-1).

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S.B. No. 1396 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026 school year.

3 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
