## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the creation of the Texas Mental Health Profession
3	Pipeline Program by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 61.070 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 61.070. TEXAS MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSION PIPELINE
8	PROGRAM. (a) In this section, "participating institution" means a
9	public senior college or university or a private or independent
10	institution of higher education that offers baccalaureate degree
11	programs and postbaccalaureate degree and certificate programs.
12	(b) The board shall establish the Texas Mental Health
13	Profession Pipeline Program and encourage participating
14	institutions to develop pipeline programs for the purpose of
15	providing a clear, guided program of study for public junior
16	college students to transfer to a participating institution to
17	pursue a baccalaureate degree or a postbaccalaureate degree or
18	certificate leading to licensure and practice as:
19	(1) a psychologist, as defined by Section 501.002,
20	Occupations Code;
21	(2) a licensed professional counselor, as defined by
22	Section 503.002, Occupations Code;
23	(3) an advanced practice registered nurse, as defined

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by Section 301.152, Occupations Code, who holds a nationally

- 1 recognized board certification in psychiatric or mental health
- 2 nursing;
- 3 (4) a licensed master social worker or a licensed
- 4 clinical social worker, as defined by Section 505.002, Occupations
- 5 Code;
- 6 (5) a licensed specialist in school psychology, as
- 7 <u>defined by Section 501.002, Occupations Code; or</u>
- 8 <u>(6) a licensed marriage and family therapist, as</u>
- 9 defined by Section 502.002, Occupations Code.
- 10 (c) A participating institution that develops a pipeline
- 11 program under Subsection (b) shall:
- 12 (1) partner with one or more public junior colleges to
- 13 create a guided program of study for public junior college
- 14 students; and
- 15 (2) ensure that a public junior college student who
- 16 <u>transfers to the participating institution:</u>
- 17 (A) does not lose any credits earned before
- 18 transferring;
- 19 (B) can earn a baccalaureate degree in less than
- 20 two years following the transfer; and
- 21 (C) after earning a baccalaureate degree, is
- 22 <u>automatically</u> admitted to a <u>postbaccalaureate</u> degree or
- 23 certificate program at the participating institution if:
- (i) the student meets the minimum academic
- 25 requirements, as determined by the participating institution; and
- 26 (ii) the postbaccalaureate degree or
- 27 certificate program has the capacity to admit new students based

1	on:
2	(a) student-to-faculty ratios
3	required by state law, federal law, the appropriate accrediting
4	organization, or institutional policy; and
5	(b) the availability of clinical
6	placements and the faculty or preceptors that supervise those
7	placements.
8	(d) The board shall designate a program of study that meets
9	the requirements of Subsection (c) as a pipeline program.
10	(e) The board shall maintain on the board's Internet website
11	information that clearly displays:
12	(1) a list of each pipeline program operating in this
13	state;
14	(2) a list of each participating institution that has
15	established a pipeline program;
16	(3) a map displaying the location of each
17	participating institution that has established a pipeline program;
18	<u>and</u>
19	(4) data regarding each pipeline program based on
20	information provided to the board under Subsection (f).
21	(f) Each participating institution shall submit an annual
22	report to the board that includes:
23	(1) the total number of students in the participating
24	institution's pipeline program;
25	(2) the number of students in the participating
26	institution's pipeline program who have transferred from a public
27	junior college to the participating institution without losing any

- 1 credits previously earned at the public junior college;
- 2 (3) the number of students in the participating
- 3 <u>institution's pipeline program who in the preceding academic year</u>
- 4 earned a baccalaureate degree from the participating institution
- 5 that was completed in two years or less;
- 6 (4) the capacity of the participating institution's
- 7 pipeline program to prepare more students for licensure and
- 8 practice as mental health professionals in the fields described by
- 9 Subsection (b);
- 10 (5) the financial resources allocated by the
- 11 participating institution to increase the number of students who
- 12 are able to complete the course of study under the participating
- 13 institution's pipeline program; and
- 14 (6) the average time for a student to complete the
- 15 course of study under the participating institution's pipeline
- 16 program from the date the student enrolls in a public junior college
- 17 to the date of the student's graduation from a postbaccalaureate
- 18 degree or certificate program.
- 19 (g) The board shall adopt rules consistent with this section
- 20 as necessary to implement this section, including rules for
- 21 <u>designating pipeline programs as described by Subsection (d).</u>
- 22 SECTION 2. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board
- 23 shall adopt rules as required by Section 61.070(g), Education Code,
- 24 as added by this Act, as soon as practicable after the effective
- 25 date of this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
