BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 402.010, Government Code, is amended by 7 adding Subsections (e), (f), and (g) to read as follows: (e) The attorney general may assert legislative privilege 8 9 on behalf of the state or a state agency or official during discovery, hearing, or trial in an action described by this section 10 unless asserting the privilege would create a conflict in the 11 attorney general's representation of the state or a state agency or 12 13 official. 14 (f) The attorney general has 30 days from the date legislative privilege is asserted under Subsection (e) to provide 15 16 evidence of representation of the state or a state agency or official who may properly assert the privilege. The provision of 17 evidence of that representation on or before that date establishes 18 the attorney general's authority to assert legislative privilege 19 under Subsection (e). 20 21 (g) The attorney general's authority under Subsection (e) is not exclusive and does not affect another person's ability to 22 23 assert legislative privilege in any matter. 24 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
