Sections 13.250(b) and (d), Water Code, are amended to read as follows: 6 7 (b) Unless the utility commission issues a certificate that neither the present nor future convenience and necessity will be 8 adversely affected, the holder of a certificate or a person who 9 possesses facilities used to provide utility service shall not 10 discontinue, reduce, or impair service to a certified service area 11 12 or part of a certified service area except [for]: 13 (1) for nonpayment of charges for services provided by 14 the certificate holder or a person who possesses facilities used to provide utility service; 15 16 (2) for nonpayment of charges for sewer service provided by another retail public utility under an agreement 17 between the retail public utility and the certificate holder or a 18 person who possesses facilities used to provide utility service or 19 20 under a utility commission-ordered arrangement between the two 21 service providers; 22 (3) for nonuse; [or] 23 (4) as necessary to maintain adequate water supplies 24 during drought conditions; or

Except as provided by this subsection, a retail public 3 (d) utility that has not been granted a certificate of public 4 5 convenience and necessity may not discontinue, reduce, or impair retail water or sewer service to any ratepayer without approval of 6 the regulatory authority. Except as provided by this subsection, a 7 8 utility or water supply corporation that is allowed to operate without a certificate of public convenience and necessity under 9 Section 13.242(c) may not discontinue, reduce, or impair retail 10 water or sewer service to any ratepayer without the approval of the 11 Subject to rules of the regulatory 12 regulatory authority. authority, a retail public utility, utility, or water supply 13 14 corporation described in this subsection may discontinue, reduce, 15 or impair retail water or sewer service [for]:

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(1) <u>for</u> nonpayment of charges;

(2) <u>for</u>nonuse; [or]

18 (3) <u>as necessary to maintain adequate water supplies</u>
19 <u>during drought conditions; or</u>

20 <u>(4) for</u> other similar reasons in the usual course of 21 business.

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SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

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
