## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 191, Health and Safety
7	Code, is amended by adding Section 191.012 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 191.012. DEATH INFORMATION PROVIDED TO CERTAIN
9	HOSPITALS. (a) In this section:
10	(1) "Hospital" means a hospital licensed under Chapter
11	<u>241.</u>
12	(2) "Trauma facility" has the meaning assigned by
13	<u>Section 773.003.</u>
14	(b) The department shall implement an efficient and
15	effective procedure to provide death information to a hospital
16	designated as a Level I trauma facility to assist with the
17	hospital's participation in the Medicaid managed care program
18	operated under Chapter 540, Government Code.
19	(c) The procedure implemented under Subsection (b) at a
20	minimum must provide the following information for each deceased
21	person for whom a death certificate is filed with a local registrar
22	in this state:
23	(1) the county of residence of the deceased;

(2) the date of birth of the deceased; and

- 1 (3) the full name of the deceased.
- 2 (d) Subject to available resources, the department may use
- 3 the procedure implemented under Subsection (b) to provide death
- 4 <u>information to a hospital that is not designated as a Level I trauma</u>
- 5 <u>facility</u>.
- 6 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 7 a state agency determines a waiver or authorization from a federal
- 8 agency is necessary for implementation of that provision, the
- 9 agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 10 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 11 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
