- 5 SECTION 1. Section 130.912, Local Government Code, is
- 6 amended by amending Subsections (d), (e), and (g) and adding
- 7 Subsection (e-1) to read as follows:
- 8 (d) The comptroller shall award a grant to a qualified
- 9 county that applies for the grant using money appropriated to the
- 10 comptroller for that purpose. The grant must be in the following
- 11 applicable amount:
- 12 (1) \$75,000 for each constable precinct in the county
- if the county has a population of less than 10,000;
- 14 (2) \$100,000 for each constable precinct in the county
- 15 if the county has a population of 10,000 or more and less than
- 16 50,000; and
- 17 (3) \$150,000 for each constable precinct in the county
- if the county has a population of 50,000 or more and 300,000 or less
- 19 [The comptroller may only award a grant to a county if the county
- 20 agrees in writing to contribute at least 75 percent of the money
- 21 required to meet the minimum annual salary requirement established
- 22 under Subsection (e) for each qualified constable for which the

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    a grant shall use or authorize the use of the grant money only:

- 9 SECTION 3. Section 130.912, Local Government Code, as
- 10 amended by this Act, applies only to the award of a grant to a county
- 11 under the rural constable's office salary assistance grant program
- 12 during a fiscal year of the county that begins on or after the
- 13 effective date of this Act.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
