- (2) [(3)] fails to honor, within a reasonable time, a check issued to the commission after the commission has sent by certified mail a request for payment to the license holder's last known business address according to commission records;
- (3) $\left[\frac{(4)}{(4)}\right]$ fails to provide, within a reasonable time,

- 1 information requested by the commission that relates to a formal or
- 2 informal complaint to the commission that would indicate a
- 3 violation of this chapter or Chapter 1102;
- 4 (4) $[\frac{(5)}{}]$ fails to surrender to the owner, without
- 5 just cause, a document or instrument that is requested by the owner
- 6 and that is in the license holder's possession;

- 23 SECTION 6. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 24 of this Act, the Texas Real Estate Commission and the Texas
- 25 Appraiser Licensing and Certification Board shall adopt rules
- 26 necessary to implement the changes in law made by this Act.
- 27 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

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- 1 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 2 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 3 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 4 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
