- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 2001.034, Government Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsection (c-1) to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (a) A state agency may adopt an emergency rule only during a
- 9 period in which a state of emergency declaration or state of
- 10 disaster declaration issued by the governor is in effect. An
- 11 emergency rule may be adopted without prior notice or hearing, or
- 12 with an abbreviated notice and a hearing that the agency [it] finds
- 13 practicable, provided that [if] the agency must:
- 14 (1) find [finds] that an imminent peril to the public
- 15 health, safety, or welfare, or a requirement of state or federal
- 16 law, requires adoption of a rule on fewer than 30 days' notice;
- 17 [and]
- 18 (2) <u>state</u> [<u>states</u>] in writing the reasons for its
- 19 finding under Subdivision (1); and
- 20 (3) inform the governor of the agency's intent to adopt
- 21 the rule.
- (c) A rule adopted under this section may be effective for
- 23 not longer than $60 \ [\frac{120}{2}]$ days and, subject to Subsection (c-1), may
- 24 be renewed once for not longer than 30 [60] days. An identical rule

- 1 may be adopted under Sections 2001.023 and 2001.029.
- 2 (c-1) A state agency may not renew a rule adopted under this
- 3 section without first holding a public hearing with a public
- 4 comment period.
- 5 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 6 a state agency emergency rule proposed on or after the effective
- 7 date of this Act. An emergency rule proposed before that date is
- 8 governed by the law in effect on the date the rule was proposed, and
- 9 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
