A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to transporting an unsecured load; creating a criminal 3 offense. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 725, Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 CHAPTER 725. TRANSPORTATION OF UNSECURED LOAD [LOOSE MATERIALS] 7 SECTION 2. Section 725.001(1), Transportation Code, is 8 amended to read as follows: 9 (1) "Load" means any object placed on a vehicle for 10 transportation [a load of loose material]. 11 12 SECTION 3. Section 725.002, Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows: 13 14 Sec. 725.002. APPLICABILITY. (a) Except as provided by this section, this [This] chapter applies to any motor vehicle, 15 16 trailer, or semitrailer operated on a public highway. 17 (b) This chapter does not apply to: 18 (1) [except] a vehicle or construction or mining equipment that is: 19 20 (A) [(1)] moving between construction barricades 21 on a public works project; or 22 (B) [(2)] crossing a public highway; 23 (2) an agricultural product in its natural state that is loaded or contained on a vehicle manufactured specifically to 24

2	(3) a commercial motor vehicle as defined by Section
3	644.001 in intrastate or interstate commerce that is regulated by
4	49 C.F.R. Sections 392.9 and 393.100-136, unless a peace officer
5	not certified under Section 644.101:
6	(A) witnesses the load is unsecured and poses an
7	imminent hazard to other users of a highway; or
8	(B) is conducting an investigation as the result
9	of the load falling from a vehicle.
10	SECTION 4. Section 725.003, Transportation Code, is amended
11	by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (b-1) to read as
12	follows:
13	(a) A person or the person's agent or employee may not
14	transport <u>a load</u> [loose material] in violation of this chapter.
15	(b-1) A person commits an offense if the person operates a
16	vehicle and a load:
17	(1) falls from the vehicle onto the roadway; or
18	(2) is positioned on the vehicle in a manner to create
19	an imminent hazard while the vehicle is in operation on a public
20	street or highway.
21	SECTION 5. The heading to Subchapter B, Chapter 725,
22	Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows:
23	SUBCHAPTER B. REQUIREMENTS FOR TRANSPORTING <u>LOAD</u> [LOOSE MATERIALS]
24	SECTION 6. Subchapter B, Chapter 725, Transportation Code,
25	is amended by adding Section 725.0201 to read as follows:
26	Sec. 725.0201. CONTAINING LOAD GENERALLY. A vehicle
27	subject to this chapter shall be operated to prevent a load from

Sections 725.021(b) and (c), Transportation 3 Code, are amended to read as follows: 4 5 A vehicle bed carrying a load of loose material: (b) 6 (1) may not have a hole, crack, or other opening 7 through which loose material can escape; and 8 (2) shall be enclosed: on both sides by side panels; 9 (A) 10 (B) on the front by a panel or the vehicle cab; and 11 on the rear by a tailgate or panel. 12 (C) (c) Except as provided by Subsection (e), the load of loose 13 material shall be covered and the covering firmly secured at the 14 15 front and back, unless the load: 16 (1) is completely enclosed by the load-carrying 17 compartment; or does not blow from or spill over the top of the 18 (2) 19 load-carrying compartment. 20 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect July 1, 2025, if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each 21 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. 22 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary to take effect on 23 24 that date, this Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

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
