Section 18.065, Election Code, is amended by 19 adding Subsections (e-1) and (g-1) to read as follows. 20 21 (e-1) On a third violation under Subsection (e), the secretary of state shall, as necessary, assume the voter 22 23 registrar's duties relating to the maintenance of the statewide voter registration list, including the registrar's duties related 24

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1 to the maintenance of accurate registration records under:

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(1) Subchapters B, C, and D, Chapter 15; and

(2) Chapter 16.

4 (g-1) It is an offense for a voter registrar to commit a
5 violation of a requirement imposed on the registrar by a provision
6 or rule described in Subsection (a) three or more times. An offense
7 under this subsection is a Class A misdemeanor.

8 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. 9 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is 10 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed, 11 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For 12 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the 13 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred 14 15 before that date.

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

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
