4	SECTION 1. Sections 46.05(a) and (d), Penal Code, are
5	amended to read as follows:
6	(a) A person commits an offense if the person intentionally
7	or knowingly possesses, manufactures, transports, repairs, or

10	registered in the National Firearms Registration and Transfer

23	(d) It is an affirmative defense to prosecution under this

(1) was incidental to dealing with a [short-barrel
 firearm or] tire deflation device solely as an antique or curio;

3 (2) was incidental to dealing with armor-piercing 4 ammunition solely for the purpose of making the ammunition 5 available to an organization, agency, or institution listed in 6 Subsection (b); or

7 (3) was incidental to dealing with a tire deflation
8 device solely for the purpose of making the device available to an
9 organization, agency, or institution listed in Subsection (b).

SECTION 2. Section 46.01(10), Penal Code, is repealed.

11 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. 12 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is 13 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed, 14 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For 15 16 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred 17 18 before that date.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
