13	(2) "Commission" means the Texas Forensic Science
14	Commission.
15	(3) "Pilot program" means the Texas forensic analyst
16	apprenticeship pilot program established under this subchapter.
17	Sec. 72.202. TEXAS FORENSIC ANALYST APPRENTICESHIP PILOT
18	PROGRAM. (a) The office shall establish the Texas forensic analyst
19	apprenticeship pilot program to increase the forensic science
20	workforce capacity in this state. The office shall collaborate with
21	the commission as necessary to administer the pilot program.
22	(b) To implement the pilot program, the office shall enter
23	into contracts with:
24	(1) general academic teaching institutions or medical

1	and dental units, as those terms are defined by Section 61.003,
2	Education Code, that provide relevant training programs in forensic
3	disciplines; and
4	(2) each publicly funded accredited crime laboratory
5	that is awarded an apprentice position by the commission under
6	<u>Section 72.203.</u>
7	Sec. 72.203. FORENSIC ANALYST APPRENTICE POSITIONS; RULES.
8	(a) In consultation with the office, the commission by rule shall
9	adopt eligibility requirements for:
10	(1) individuals who may apply for an apprentice
11	position under the pilot program; and
12	(2) publicly funded accredited crime laboratories
13	that may apply to sponsor an apprentice under the pilot program.
14	(b) In establishing the eligibility requirements under
15	Subsection (a), the commission shall prioritize the long-term
16	retention of forensic analysts in accredited crime laboratories in
17	this state.
18	(c) The commission shall award apprentice positions to
19	individuals and accredited crime laboratories that meet the
20	eligibility requirements established under Subsection (a). The
21	commission shall enter into contracts with the laboratories
22	selected to sponsor apprentices under the pilot program.
23	(d) The commission shall consult with the Texas Association
24	of Crime Lab Directors to determine the current need for forensic
25	analyst apprentices in each forensic discipline.
