18	PROGRAM. (a) The office shall establish the Texas forensic analyst
19	apprenticeship pilot program to increase the forensic science
20	workforce capacity in this state. The office shall collaborate with
21	the commission as necessary to administer the pilot program.
22	(b) To implement the pilot program, the office shall enter
23	into contracts with:
