## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
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- 2 relating to the composition of, appointment of, and qualifications
- 3 for the state commission of insurance.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 31.001(1), Insurance Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (1) "Commission" ["Commissioner"] means the state
- 8 commission [commissioner] of insurance.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 31.007, Insurance Code, is amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 31.007. REFERENCES TO BOARD OR COMMISSIONER. A
- 12 reference in this code or other law to the <u>former</u> State Board of
- 13 Insurance, the Board of Insurance Commissioners, [or) an individual
- 14 commissioner, or the commissioner of insurance means the commission
- 15 [commissioner] or the department as consistent with the respective
- 16 duties of the commission [commissioner] and the department under
- 17 this code and other insurance laws.
- 18 SECTION 3. The heading to Subchapter B, Chapter 31,
- 19 Insurance Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 20 SUBCHAPTER B. STATE COMMISSION [COMMISSIONER] OF INSURANCE
- 21 SECTION 4. Section 31.021, Insurance Code, is amended to
- 22 read as follows:
- Sec. 31.021. GOVERNING BODY [CHIEF EXECUTIVE]. (a) The
- 24 commission [commissioner] is the department's governing body

- 1 [chief executive and administrative officer]. The commission
- 2 [commissioner] shall administer and enforce this code, other
- 3 insurance laws of this state, and other laws granting jurisdiction
- 4 or applicable to the department or the commission [commissioner].
- 5 (b) The <u>commission</u> [<del>commissioner</del>] has the powers and duties 6 vested in the department by:
- 7 (1) this code and other insurance laws of this state;
- 8 and
- 9 (2) Title 5, Labor Code, and other workers'
- 10 compensation insurance laws of this state.
- 11 SECTION 5. Section 31.022, Insurance Code, is amended to
- 12 read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 31.022. APPOINTMENT; TERM; PRESIDING OFFICER.
- 14 (a) The governor, with the advice and consent of the senate, shall
- 15 appoint three members to serve on the commission serving staggered
- 16 terms of six years [the commissioner. The commissioner serves a
- 17 two-year term that expires on February 1 of each odd-numbered
- 18 <del>year</del>].
- 19 (b) In appointing members to serve on the commission, the
- 20 governor shall appoint:
- 21 (1) one member with expertise in insurance regulation;
- (2) one member with expertise in insurance
- 23 administration; and
- 24 (3) one member with expertise in insurance consumer
- 25 advocacy.
- 26 (c) The governor shall designate one member of the
- 27 commission as the presiding officer. The presiding officer:

- 1 (1) serves at the pleasure of the governor;
- 2 (2) serves for a two-year term that expires February 1
- 3 of each odd-numbered year; and
- 4 (3) is ineligible to be designated as presiding
- 5 officer more than once during a six-year period.
- 6 (d) The governor shall appoint a member of the commission
- 7 [the commissioner] without regard to the race, color, disability,
- 8 sex, religion, age, or national origin of the appointee.
- 9 SECTION 6. Section 31.023, Insurance Code, is amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- Sec. 31.023. QUALIFICATIONS. A member of the commission
- 12 [The commissioner] must:
- 13 (1) be a competent and experienced administrator;
- 14 (2) be well informed and qualified in the field of
- 15 insurance and insurance regulation; [and]
- 16 (3) be well informed and qualified in consumer
- 17 advocacy;
- 18 (4) have at least five years of experience in the
- 19 administration of business or government or as a practicing
- 20 attorney, [er] certified public accountant, physician, dentist,
- 21 chiropractor, podiatrist, or health care administrator or business
- 22 <u>owner; and</u>
- 23 <u>(5) be a resident of this state</u>.
- SECTION 7. Section 31.024, Insurance Code, is amended to
- 25 read as follows:
- Sec. 31.024. INELIGIBILITY FOR PUBLIC OFFICE. A member of
- 27 the commission [The commissioner] is ineligible to be a candidate

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- 1 for  $\underline{another}$  [ $\underline{a}$ ] public elective office in this state, unless the
- 2 member [commissioner] has resigned and the governor has accepted
- 3 the resignation.
- 4 SECTION 8. Section 31.027, Insurance Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 31.027. GROUNDS FOR REMOVAL. (a) It is a ground for
- 7 removal from office if a member of the commission [the
- 8 commissioner :
- 9 (1) does not have at the time of appointment the
- 10 qualifications required by Section 31.023;
- 11 (2) does not maintain during service as member
- 12 [commissioner] the qualifications required by Section 31.023;
- 13 (3) violates a prohibition established by Section
- 14 33.001, 33.003, 33.004, or 33.005; or
- 15 (4) cannot, because of illness or disability,
- 16 discharge the <a href="member's">member's</a> [commissioner's] duties for a substantial
- 17 part of the member's [commissioner's] term.
- 18 (b) The validity of an action of the commission
- 19 [commissioner] or the department is not affected by the fact that it
- 20 is taken when a ground for removal of <u>a member of</u> the <u>commission</u>
- 21 [commissioner] exists.
- SECTION 9. Sections 33.002(a) and (b), Insurance Code, are
- 23 amended to read as follows:
- 24 (a) A person is not eligible for appointment as a member of
- 25 the commission [commissioner] if the person, the person's spouse,
- 26 or any other person who resides in the same household as the person:
- 27 (1) is registered, certified, or licensed by the

- 1 department;
- 2 (2) is employed by or participates in the management
- 3 of a business entity or other organization regulated by or
- 4 receiving funds from the department;
- 5 (3) owns or controls, directly or indirectly, more
- 6 than a 10 percent interest in a business entity or other
- 7 organization regulated by or receiving funds from the department;
- 8 or
- 9 (4) uses or receives a substantial amount of tangible
- 10 goods, services, or funds from the department, other than
- 11 compensation or reimbursement authorized by law.
- 12 (b) A person is not eligible for appointment as <u>a member of</u>
- 13 the commission [commissioner] if the person:
- 14 (1) is a stockholder, director, officer, attorney,
- 15 agent, or employee of an insurance company, insurance agent,
- 16 insurance broker, or insurance adjuster; or
- 17 (2) is directly or indirectly interested in a business
- 18 described by Subdivision (1).
- 19 SECTION 10. Sections 33.004(a) and (b), Insurance Code, are
- 20 amended to read as follows:
- 21 (a) A person who is an officer, employee, or paid consultant
- 22 of a trade association in the field of insurance may not be:
- 23 (1) <u>a member of the commission</u> [commissioner]; or
- 24 (2) an employee of the department who is exempt from
- 25 the state's position classification plan or is compensated at or
- 26 above the amount prescribed by the General Appropriations Act for
- 27 step 1, salary group A17, of the position classification salary

- 1 schedule.
- 2 (b) A person who is the spouse of an officer, manager, or
- 3 paid consultant of a trade association in the field of insurance may
- 4 not be:
- 5 (1) a member of the commission [commissioner]; or
- 6 (2) an employee of the department who is exempt from
- 7 the state's position classification plan or is compensated at or
- 8 above the amount prescribed by the General Appropriations Act for
- 9 step 1, salary group A17, of the position classification salary
- 10 schedule.
- 11 SECTION 11. Not later than December 1, 2025, the governor
- 12 shall:
- 13 (1) appoint each initial member of the state
- 14 commission of insurance to serve staggered terms beginning January
- 15 1, 2026, with one of the members serving a two-year term, one of the
- 16 members serving a four-year term, and one of the members serving a
- 17 six-year term; and
- 18 (2) designate a member appointed under Subdivision (1)
- 19 of this section as the initial presiding officer of the state
- 20 commission of insurance.
- 21 SECTION 12. Until each member of the initial state
- 22 commission of insurance is appointed and confirmed by the senate in
- 23 the manner provided by Section 31.022, Insurance Code, as amended
- 24 by this Act, the commissioner of insurance serving on the effective
- 25 date of this Act shall, unless otherwise removed as provided by law,
- 26 continue in office under the prior law that governed the office, and
- 27 that prior law is continued in effect for that purpose. If on

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- 1 January 1, 2026, there is a vacancy in the office of a member of the
- 2 state commission of insurance created under this Act because the
- 3 initial appointee has not been confirmed by the senate as provided
- 4 by Section 31.022, Insurance Code, as amended by this Act, has died,
- 5 or refuses or is permanently unable to serve, the commissioner
- 6 serving on that date shall, unless otherwise removed as provided by
- 7 law, continue in office under the prior law that governed the office
- 8 until the governor fills the vacancy by appointment in the manner
- 9 provided by Section 31.022, Insurance Code, as amended by this Act.
- 10 The prior law that governed the office of the commissioner of
- 11 insurance is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 12 SECTION 13. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
