A 2-7 proceeding before the Public Utility Commission of Texas or other 2-8 regulatory authority described by Section 11.003, Utilities Code, 2-9 that commenced before the effective date of this Act is governed by 2-10 the law in effect on the date the proceeding commenced, and that law 2-11 is continued in effect for that purpose.

2-12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.

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
