A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to a study by the Department of State Health Services on prevention and reduction of diabetes-related amputation. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 In this Act, "department" means 5 SECTION 1. (a) the Department of State Health Services. 6 7 The department shall conduct a study on the prevention (b) and reduction of diabetes-related amputation. 8 In conducting the study, the department shall: 9 (c) identify and examine information on amputations 10 (1)11 resulting from diabetes; and 12 (2) develop recommendations regarding: 13 (A) amputation prevention related to diabetic 14 foot ulcers and peripheral artery disease; methods for increasing public awareness of 15 (B) diabetes-related amputation; 16 17 (C) best practices for reducing the number of amputations performed; and 18 policy solutions for ensuring access 19 (D) to 20 treatments to assist with preventing amputation, including: 21 (i) insurance coverage for therapies 22 designed to treat diabetic foot ulcers, including topical oxygen therapy; 23 (ii) timely 24 and equitable access to

No. 1677 evidence-supported medical tools, technologies, and services to 1 assist with the prevention of avoidable amputations; 2 3 (iii) methods to improve and incentivize quality care to avoid amputations when possible; and 4 5 (iv) methods to promote collaboration and 6 cooperation among interested persons. 7 In conducting the study, the department shall consult (d) 8 with the following individuals: the commissioner of state health services; 9 (1)10 (2) a physician licensed in this state who specializes 11 in endocrinology; 12 (3) a nurse licensed in this state with expertise in diabetes education; 13 14 (4) a vascular surgeon with expertise in amputation 15 prevention; 16 a physician, physician assistant, or advanced (5) 17 practice registered nurse with expertise in amputation prevention; a podiatrist with expertise in treating diabetic 18 (6) foot ulcers; 19 a podiatrist or vascular surgeon affiliated with 20 (7)the United States Department of Veterans Affairs; 21 a representative of a public health provider; 22 (8) 23 (9) at least three individuals diagnosed with diabetes 24 or who have experienced diabetes-related amputation; 25 (10) a representative of the American Diabetes 26 Association; and 27 (11)other individuals as the department determines

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1 necessary.

(e) Not later than September 1, 2026, the department shall
prepare and submit to the governor and the legislature a report
summarizing the results of the study and containing recommendations
for legislative or other action. The department shall post the
report on the department's Internet website. The post must include:

7 (1) the information on which the department's
8 determinations and recommendations is based; and

9 (2) the methodologies the department used to conduct10 the study.

- 11 SECTION 2. This Act expires September 1, 2027.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
