9	results from a defendant's act constituting the use of force or

11	(1) a grand jury finds no bill of indictment for
12	criminal charges based on the act;
13	(2) a court in a criminal proceeding orders a
14	dismissal of criminal charges based on the act; or
15	(3) the defendant is acquitted of criminal charges
16	based on the act.
17	Sec. 83.003. CLAIMANT'S LIABILITY FOR COURT COSTS AND
18	ATTORNEY'S FEES. A claimant who is barred from recovery under this
19	chapter is liable to the defendant for court costs and reasonable
20	attorney's fees incurred in defending against the barred claim.
21	SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
22	a cause of action that accrues on or after the effective date of
23	this Act. A cause of action that accrued before the effective date
24	of this Act is governed by the law applicable to the cause of action

- 1 immediately before the effective date of this Act and that law is
- 2 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
