7	SECTION 1. Chapter 91, Natural Resources Code, is amended

9	SUBCHAPTER U. OIL OR GAS EMERGENCIES
10	Sec. 91.951. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "oil or gas
11	emergency" means an emergency related to an oil and gas operation,
12	as defined by Section 81.0523, including the uncontrolled release
13	of oil, gas, or produced water from an oil or gas well or other type
14	of well regulated by the commission.
15	Sec. 91.952. EMERGENCY DECLARATION. (a) The executive
16	director of the commission may declare an oil or gas emergency if
17	the executive director finds that an oil or gas emergency has
18	occurred. A declaration issued under this section must:
19	(1) be in writing;
20	(2) be authorized by the executive director; and
21	(3) include:
22	(A) a description of the nature of the oil or gas
23	emergency; and
24	(B) a designation of the area threatened by the

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- 1 <u>oil or gas emergency.</u>
- 2 (b) An emergency declaration issued under Subsection (a)
- 3 may not continue for more than 30 days unless renewed as provided by
- 4 this subsection. If the commission determines that the emergency
- 5 is likely to continue beyond the 30th day after the date the
- 6 emergency was declared under Subsection (a), the commission may
- 7 renew the declaration for additional 30-day periods as necessary
- 8 for public health and safety until the emergency no longer exists.
- 9 <u>(c) If the commission determines that an oil or gas</u>
- 10 emergency no longer exists, the commission may terminate the
- 11 <u>declaration issued under Subsection (a) or allow the declaration to</u>
- 12 expire.
- 13 Sec. 91.953. EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE. (a) Except in the case
- 14 of gross negligence, recklessness, or intentional misconduct, a
- 15 person is immune from civil liability for an act or omission that
- 16 occurs in giving assistance, advice, or resources, including the
- 17 use of the person's assets, employees, or contractors, with respect
- 18 to the response to an oil or gas emergency:
- 19 (1) that is declared under Section 91.952; and
- 20 (2) in which the assistance, advice, or resources are
- 21 provided at the request of an authorized representative of a state,
- 22 local, or federal agency.
- 23 (b) The immunities provided by this section are in addition
- 24 to any other immunity or limitations of liability provided by law.
- 25 SECTION 2. Subchapter U, Chapter 91, Natural Resources
- 26 Code, as added by this Act, does not apply to a cause of action that
- 27 accrued before the effective date of this Act.
