A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the transition of the nurse aide certification program
- 3 from the Health and Human Services Commission to the Texas Board of
- 4 Nursing and the creation of a workgroup on nursing career pathways.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. NURSE AIDE CERTIFICATION PROGRAM. (a) The Texas
- 7 Board of Nursing and the Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 8 jointly develop an operational plan for transitioning the nurse
- 9 aide certification program from the Health and Human Services
- 10 Commission to the Texas Board of Nursing. The study must include
- 11 all financial, operational, and other relevant considerations
- 12 necessary for the transition.
- 13 (b) Not later than December 1, 2026, the Texas Board of
- 14 Nursing and the Health and Human Services Commission shall submit
- 15 the plan developed under this section to the governor, the
- 16 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives,
- 17 and each standing committee of the legislature with primary
- 18 jurisdiction over nursing.
- 19 SECTION 2. NURSING CAREER PATHWAYS. (a) The Texas Center
- 20 for Nursing Workforce Studies shall establish and oversee a
- 21 workgroup to assess the feasibility of better aligning the
- 22 certification and career pathways of nurse aides, medication aides,
- 23 and personal care technicians into the nursing profession.
- 24 (b) The workgroup must include:

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- 1 (1) the executive head of each of the following
- 2 entities, or that person's designated representative:
- 3 (A) the Texas Board of Nursing;
- 4 (B) the Health and Human Services Commission;
- 5 (C) the Texas Workforce Commission;
- 6 (D) the Texas Education Agency; and
- 7 (E) the Texas Higher Education Coordinating
- 8 Board; and
- 9 (2) relevant academic or health care professionals.
- 10 (c) In conducting the assessment under this section, the
- 11 workgroup shall consider and evaluate:
- 12 (1) the standards, regulations, and laws currently
- 13 impacting the nursing profession;
- 14 (2) the feasibility of alignment in certification
- 15 requirements for nurse aides, medication aides, and personal care
- 16 technicians to minimize duplicative efforts in the educational
- 17 pathways in nursing; and
- 18 (3) the present and future impact of new business
- 19 practices and advancing technologies in health care.
- 20 (d) Not later than December 1, 2026, the workgroup
- 21 established under this section shall submit a report summarizing
- 22 the results of the assessment conducted under this section to the
- 23 governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of
- 24 representatives, and each standing committee of the legislature
- 25 with primary jurisdiction over nursing.
- SECTION 3. EXPIRATION. This Act expires January 1, 2027.
- 27 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September

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1 1, 2025.
