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- 1 If the governing body fails or refuses to disannex the 2 area within 60 days after the date of the receipt of the petition, any one or more of the signers of the petition may bring a cause of 3 4 action in a district court of the county in which the area is principally located to request that the area be disannexed. On the 5 filing of an answer by the governing body, and on application of 6 7 either party, the case shall be advanced and heard without further delay in accordance with rules for expedited actions under the 8 Texas Rules of Civil Procedure. The district court shall enter an order disannexing the area and award attorney's fees to the signers 10 11 of the petition if the court finds that a valid petition was filed with the municipality and that the municipality [failed to]: 12
- 13 (1) <u>failed to</u> perform its obligations in accordance 14 with:
