Section 323.004(b), Health and Safety Code, is 5 amended to read as follows: 6 A health care facility providing care to a sexual 7 (b) assault survivor shall provide the survivor with: 8 9 (1) subject to Subsection (b-1), a forensic medical examination in accordance with Subchapter B, Chapter 420, 10 Government Code, and Subchapter G, Chapter 56A, Code of Criminal 11 12 Procedure; 13 (2) a private area, if available, to wait or speak with 14 the appropriate medical, legal, or sexual assault crisis center staff or volunteer until a physician, nurse, or physician assistant 15 16 is able to treat the survivor; (3) access to a sexual assault program advocate, if 17 available, as provided by Subchapter H, Chapter 56A, Code of 18 Criminal Procedure; 19 20 (4) the information form required by Section 323.005; 21 (5) a private treatment room, if available; 22 (6) if indicated by the history of contact, access to 23 appropriate prophylaxis for exposure to sexually transmitted 24 infections;

1 (7) the name and telephone number of the nearest 2 sexual assault crisis center; [and] (8) if the health care facility has shower facilities, 3 4 access to a shower at no cost to the survivor after the examination 5 described by Subdivision (1); and 6 (9) if the survivor consents and the treatment is 7 clinically indicated, an emergency contraceptive approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration to prevent pregnancy. 8
