9	(1) "Medical school" has the meaning assigned by

12	(2) "Pediatric subspecialty" means a pediatric
13	medical subspecialty certification offered by a member board of the
14	American Board of Medical Specialties or American Osteopathic
15	Association.
16	(b) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board may
17	contract with one or more organizations to operate a statewide
18	pediatric subspecialty preceptorship program for medical students
19	enrolled in Texas medical schools.
20	(c) An organization eligible to receive funds under this

- 2 (d) Students eligible to participate in the preceptorship
- 3 program under this section must indicate an interest in a career in

- 5 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026
- 6 academic year.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
