S.B. No. 2018

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the strong families credit against certain taxes for
entities that contribute to certain organizations.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Chapter 171, Tax Code, is amended by adding
Subchapter P to read as follows:

SUBCHAPTER P. STRONG FAMILIES TAX CREDIT

Sec. 171.801. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:

(1) "At-risk family" has the meaning assigned by
Section 137.002, Human Resources Code.

(2) "Designated contribution" means a monetary
contribution to an eligible organization that the contributor
designates at the time of contribution as being made for the purpose
of the strong families credit.

(3) "Eligible organization" means an organization
determined to be an eligible organization under this subchapter.

(4) "State campaign manager" and "state policy
committee" have the meanings assigned by Section 659.131,
Government Code.

(5) "Strong families credit" means the tax credit
established under this subchapter.

Sec. 171.802. ELIGIBILITY FOR CREDIT. A taxable entity
that makes a designated contribution that meets the requirements of
this subchapter is eligible to apply for a strong families credit in

1 the amount and under the conditions provided by this subchapter
2 against the tax imposed under this chapter.

3 Sec. 171.803. QUALIFICATIONS FOR ELIGIBLE ORGANIZATION.

4 (a) An organization is an eligible organization under this
5 subchapter if the organization:

6 (1) is exempt from federal income taxation under
7 Section 501(a), Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as an organization
8 described by Section 501(c)(3) of that code;

9 (2) is authorized to transact business in this state;

10 (3) has provided the following in this state for at
11 least three years preceding the organization's receipt of the
12 organization's initial designated contribution:

13 (A) comprehensive case management services for
14 at-risk families based on an assessment of family strengths and
15 needs, including assisting families in achieving self-sufficiency
16 and stability and encouraging workforce participation; or

17 (B) services and resources to assist fathers in
18 learning and improving parenting skills and being more engaged in
19 their children's lives through in-school programs and online
20 resources;

21 (4) does not directly or indirectly provide abortion
22 services, or offer information related to abortion services; and

23 (5) has not received, either directly or indirectly
24 through a contractor, more than 50 percent of its total annual
25 revenue from this state or a political subdivision of this state in
26 the preceding state fiscal year.

27 (b) To remain an eligible organization, an organization

1 must submit each calendar year the following information in the
2 manner prescribed by the comptroller:

3 (1) a description of the qualifying services and
4 resources provided by the organization;

5 (2) the total number of individuals served through the
6 services and resources described by Subdivision (1) during the
7 previous calendar year and the number of those individuals served
8 and provided with resources that year using designated
9 contributions;

10 (3) outcomes for services and resources described by
11 Subdivision (1);

12 (4) the organization's financial information;

13 (5) the organization's contact information;

14 (6) a statement, signed under penalty of perjury by an
15 officer of the organization, that the organization meets all
16 criteria to qualify as an eligible organization, has fulfilled the
17 requirements for the previous calendar year, and intends to fulfill
18 the requirements for the next calendar year; and

19 (7) any other documentation necessary to verify
20 eligibility or compliance with this section.

21 (c) The comptroller may consult with the state campaign
22 manager and state policy committee to determine the manner in which
23 an organization must demonstrate that the organization is an
24 eligible organization for purposes of this subchapter.

25 Sec. 171.804. DUTIES OF ELIGIBLE ORGANIZATION. (a) An
26 eligible organization shall:

27 (1) conduct a local, state, and national criminal

background check for all individuals working directly with children in a program funded by designated contributions that includes the use of:

(A) a commercial multistate and multijurisdiction criminal records locator or other similar commercial nationwide database; and

(B) the national sex offender registry database maintained by the United States Department of Justice or a successor agency;

(2) spend all designated contributions, other than the amount described by Subdivision (3), to provide services or resources for residents of this state;

(3) spend no more than five percent of the total dollar amount of designated contributions on administrative expenses; and

(4) annually submit to the comptroller a copy of the eligible organization's most recent Form 990 filed with the Internal Revenue Service.

(b) On receipt of a designated contribution, an eligible organization shall provide the entity making the contribution with a certificate of contribution that includes:

(1) the entity's name;

(2) the eligible organization's name;

(3) the entity's federal employer identification number, if applicable;

(4) the entity's state taxpayer identification number, if applicable;

(5) the amount of the designated contribution; and

1 (6) the date the designated contribution was made.

2 Sec. 171.805. AMOUNT OF CREDIT; LIMITATION ON TOTAL
3 CREDITS. (a) Subject to Subsections (b) and (c), the amount of a
4 taxable entity's credit for a report is equal to the lesser of:

5 (1) the amount of designated contributions made to
6 eligible organizations during the period covered by the report; or

7 (2) the amount of franchise tax due for the report
8 after applying all other applicable credits.

9 (b) A taxable entity may not apply for a credit for a report
10 in connection with more than \$1 million in designated
11 contributions.

12 (c) The total amount of strong families credits awarded may
13 not exceed \$5 million each year.

14 Sec. 171.806. CARRYFORWARD. (a) If a taxable entity is
15 eligible for a credit that exceeds the limitation under Section
16 171.805(a), the entity may carry the unused credit forward for not
17 more than five consecutive reports.

18 (b) A carryforward is considered the remaining portion of a
19 credit awarded to a taxable entity that cannot be claimed on a
20 report because of the limitation under Section 171.805(a).

21 Sec. 171.807. APPLICATION FOR CREDIT. (a) The comptroller
22 may award a credit to a taxable entity that applies for the credit
23 under this subchapter if the taxable entity is eligible for the
24 credit and the credit is available under Section 171.805(c).

25 (b) A taxable entity must apply for the credit in the manner
26 prescribed by the comptroller and include with the application any
27 information requested by the comptroller to determine whether the

1 entity is eligible for the credit under this subchapter. The
2 comptroller may adopt rules prescribing the application process for
3 the credit, including rules prescribing:

4 (1) a process by which the credit is awarded on a
5 first-come, first-served basis;

6 (2) an enrollment period with application deadlines to
7 submit an application for the credit;

8 (3) a requirement that a taxable entity must apply for
9 the credit using an electronic application; and

10 (4) the information required to be submitted with the
11 application for the credit, including the certificate of
12 contribution described by Section 171.804(b).

13 (c) The comptroller may rely on an audited cost report
14 provided by a taxable entity in awarding a credit under this
15 subchapter.

16 (d) A taxable entity may not apply for an amount of credit
17 greater than the amount determined under Section 171.805(a)(1) or
18 (b), as applicable.

19 (e) A taxable entity may be awarded an amount of credit less
20 than the total amount of credit to which the entity would otherwise
21 be entitled if awarding the entity the total amount of credit would
22 exceed the limitation under Section 171.805(c).

23 (f) The comptroller shall notify a taxable entity in writing
24 of the amount of credit, if any, awarded to the entity.

25 (g) The award or denial of a credit under this subchapter
26 and the amount of any credit awarded is not a contested case under
27 Chapter 2001, Government Code.

1 (h) Subject to the limitations prescribed by this
2 subchapter, a taxable entity may claim the amount of credit awarded
3 by the comptroller on the report originally due after the entity
4 receives the notice described by Subsection (f).

5 Sec. 171.808. CREDIT FOR DESIGNATED CONTRIBUTION MADE BY
6 MEMBER OF COMBINED GROUP OR TIERED PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT. (a) A
7 credit under this subchapter for designated contributions made by a
8 member of an affiliated group that files a combined report under
9 Section 171.1015 must be claimed on the combined report required by
10 Section 171.1014 for the group, and the combined group is
11 considered the taxable entity making the designated contribution
12 for purposes of this subchapter.

13 (b) An upper tier entity that includes the total revenue of
14 a lower tier entity for purposes of computing its taxable margin as
15 authorized by Section 171.1015 may claim the credit under this
16 subchapter for designated contributions made by the lower tier
17 entity to the extent of the upper tier entity's ownership interest
18 in the lower tier entity. No more than \$1 million in credit awarded
19 for designated contributions made during the period on which a
20 report is based may be claimed on the report.

21 Sec. 171.809. ASSIGNMENT PROHIBITED; EXCEPTION. A taxable
22 entity may not convey, assign, or transfer a strong families credit
23 awarded under this subchapter to another taxable entity unless
24 substantially all of the assets of the taxable entity are conveyed,
25 assigned, or transferred in the same transaction.

26 Sec. 171.810. RULES. The comptroller may adopt rules and
27 procedures necessary to implement, administer, and enforce this

1 subchapter.

2 Sec. 171.811. EXPIRATION. (a) This subchapter expires
3 January 1, 2029.

4 (b) The expiration of this subchapter does not affect the
5 carryforward of a credit under Section 171.806 or those credits for
6 which a taxable entity is eligible after the date this subchapter
7 expires based on designated contributions made before that date.

8 SECTION 2. (a) A taxable entity may apply for a credit
9 under Subchapter P, Chapter 171, Tax Code, as added by this Act,
10 only for a designated contribution made on or after June 1, 2026.

11 (b) Subchapter P, Chapter 171, Tax Code, as added by this
12 Act, applies only to a report originally due on or after June 1,
13 2026.

14 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect June 1, 2026.
