## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to authorizing a statewide referendum allowing voters to
- 3 indicate a preference for observing year-round standard time or
- 4 daylight saving time.

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- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 312.016, Government Code, is amended by
- 7 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 8 (d) The state, acting under the exemption provisions of
- 9 Section 3(a), Uniform Time Act of 1966 (15 U.S.C. Section 260a(a)),
- 10 is exempt from the provisions of that law that establish daylight
- 11 saving time. The exemption provided by this subsection applies to
- 12 both the portion of the state using central standard time as the
- 13 official standard time and the portion of the state using mountain
- 14 standard time as the official standard time.
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 312.016, Government Code, is amended by
- 16 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 17 <u>(d) The state, acting as authorized under federal law, shall</u>
- 18 observe daylight saving time year-round. This subsection applies
- 19 to both the portion of the state using central standard time as the
- 20 official standard time and the portion of the state using mountain
- 21 standard time as the official standard time.
- 22 SECTION 3. (a) At the general election to be held on
- 23 November 4, 2025, a statewide referendum shall be conducted to
- 24 allow the voters of this state to indicate a preference for either:

- 1 (1) observing standard time year-round; or
- 2 (2) observing daylight saving time year-round.
- 3 (b) The ballot for the referendum shall be printed to state
- 4 as follows: "Which of the following do you prefer?
- 5 "Observing standard time year-round."
- 6 "Observing daylight saving time year-round."
- 7 (c) The secretary of state shall design the ballot for the
- 8 referendum to enable a voter to select either of the statements set
- 9 out in Subsection (b) of this section as the voter's preference.
- 10 (d) The proposition for the referendum shall be printed on
- 11 the ballot under the heading: "Referendum Proposition" immediately
- 12 following the proposed constitutional amendment authorizing a
- 13 statewide referendum to allow the voters to choose between
- 14 observing standard time year-round and observing daylight saving
- 15 time year-round.
- 16 (e) Notice of the election shall be given in the same manner
- 17 that notice of proposed constitutional amendments is given.
- 18 (f) Returns of the votes cast on the proposition shall be
- 19 prepared and canvassed in the same manner as the returns on the
- 20 proposed constitutional amendments. Immediately after the results
- 21 of the election are certified, the secretary of state shall
- 22 transmit a copy of the certification to the lieutenant governor and
- 23 the speaker of the house of representatives.
- SECTION 4. (a) If the constitutional amendment proposed by
- 25 the 89th Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, authorizing the
- 26 statewide referendum under Section 3 of this Act is approved by the
- 27 voters and if a majority of the votes cast in the statewide

- 1 referendum are in favor of "Observing standard time year-round,"
- 2 Section 1 of this Act takes effect January 1, 2026, and Section 2 of
- 3 this Act does not take effect.
- 4 (b) If the constitutional amendment proposed by the 89th
- 5 Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, authorizing the statewide
- 6 referendum under Section 3 of this Act is approved by the voters and
- 7 if a majority of the votes cast in the statewide referendum are in
- 8 favor of "Observing daylight saving time year-round," Section 1 of
- 9 this Act does not take effect and Section 2 of this Act takes effect
- 10 only if the United States Congress enacts legislation that becomes
- 11 law that authorizes the State of Texas to observe daylight saving
- 12 time year-round. If the United States Congress does not enact
- 13 legislation that becomes law described by this subsection, Section
- 14 2 of this Act has no effect.
- SECTION 5. (a) Except as otherwise provided by this Act,
- 16 this Act takes effect immediately if this Act receives a vote of
- 17 two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by
- 18 Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not
- 19 receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes
- 20 effect September 1, 2025.
- 21 (b) This Act takes effect only if the 89th Legislature,
- 22 Regular Session, 2025, proposes a constitutional amendment
- 23 authorizing a statewide referendum allowing voters to indicate a
- 24 preference for observing year-round standard time or daylight
- 25 saving time. If the 89th Legislature, Regular Session, 2025, does
- 26 not propose such a constitutional amendment, this Act has no
- 27 effect.

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(c) Section 4 of this Act and, subject to Section 4, Sections

1 and 2 of this Act take effect only if the constitutional amendment

proposed by the 89th Legislature, Regular Session, 2025,

authorizing a statewide referendum allowing voters to indicate a

preference for observing year-round standard time or daylight

saving time is approved by the voters. If that amendment is not

approved by the voters, Sections 1, 2, and 4 of this Act have no

effect.
