A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

1

2 relating to the establishment, powers and duties, terms, and 3 governance of certain advisory bodies for programs administered by 4 the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 301.053, Agriculture Code, is amended to 7 read as follows:

8 Sec. 301.053. ADVISORY BOARDS [COMMITTEES]. The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation may establish advisory 9 10 boards [committees] to advise the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation and to make recommendations to the Texas Department of 11 12 Licensing and Regulation concerning legislation, policies, 13 administration, research, and other matters related to the duties, powers, or functions of the Texas Department of Licensing and 14 15 Regulation under this chapter.

SECTION 2. Section 1001.058, Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 1001.058. ADVISORY <u>BOARD</u> [COMMITTEE]. (a) The commission shall establish an advisory <u>board</u> [committee] to advise the commission and department on rules and educational and technical matters relevant to the administration of this chapter.

(b) The advisory <u>board</u> [committee] consists of nine members
appointed for staggered six-year terms by the presiding officer of
the commission, with the approval of the commission, as follows:

(1) three driver education providers; 1 2 (2) three driving safety providers; one driver education instructor; 3 (3) 4 (4) the division head of the Department of Public Safety driver license division or the division head's designee; and 5 (5) one member of the public. 6 7 (c) The presiding officer of the commission shall appoint

8 the presiding officer of the advisory <u>board for a term of two years</u> 9 [committee]. The presiding officer of the advisory <u>board</u> 10 [committee] may vote on any matter before the advisory <u>board</u> 11 [committee].

(d) [A member may not serve two consecutive full terms.

13 [(e)] If a vacancy occurs during a term, the presiding 14 officer of the commission, with the approval of the commission, 15 shall appoint a replacement who meets the qualifications of the 16 vacated position to serve for the remainder of the term.

17 (e) [(f)] A member of the advisory <u>board</u> [committee] may be 18 removed from the advisory <u>board</u> [committee] as provided by Section 19 51.209, Occupations Code.

20 (f) [(g)] Members of the advisory <u>board</u> [committee] may not 21 receive compensation but are entitled to reimbursement for actual 22 and necessary expenses incurred in performing the functions of the 23 advisory <u>board</u> [committee], subject to the General Appropriations 24 Act.

25 (g) [(i)] Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to
 26 the advisory <u>board</u> [committee].

27 SECTION 3. Section 469.053, Government Code, is amended to

Sec. 469.053. ADVISORY BOARD [COMMITTEE]; TERMS; MEETINGS; 2 REVIEW OF AND COMMENT ON RULES. (a) The presiding officer of the 3 4 commission, with the commission's approval, shall appoint an advisory board [committee] for the architectural barriers program. 5 The board [committee] shall consist of building professionals and 6 7 persons with disabilities who are familiar with architectural barrier problems and solutions. The board [committee] shall 8 9 consist of at least eight members. A majority of the members of the board [committee] must be persons with disabilities. 10

18 (d) The presiding officer of the commission, with the 19 commission's approval, shall appoint a <u>board</u> [committee] member as 20 presiding officer for two years.

(e) [(f) The committee periodically shall review the rules
 relating to the architectural barriers program and recommend
 changes in the rules to the commission.

[(g)] The commission must submit all proposed changes to any rule or procedure that relates to the architectural barriers program to the <u>board</u> [committee] for review and comment before adopting or implementing the new or amended rule or procedure.

10 (4) is required to register as a lobbyist under 11 Chapter 305, Government Code, because of the person's activities 12 for compensation on behalf of an entity required to be licensed 13 under this chapter.

14 <u>(f)</u> [(g)] The presiding officer of the commission may 15 remove from the advisory <u>board</u> [committee] a member who is 16 ineligible for membership under Subsection <u>(e)</u>[(f)].

17 (g) [(h)] A member may not receive compensation for service 18 on the advisory <u>board</u> [committee]. Subject to the department's 19 budget and any limitation provided by the General Appropriations 20 Act, a <u>board</u> [committee] member may receive reimbursement for the 21 actual and necessary expenses incurred while performing advisory 22 <u>board</u> [committee] duties.

23 (h) [(i)] A decision of the advisory <u>board</u> [committee] is
 24 effective only on a majority vote of the members present.

25 (i) [(j)] Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to 26 the size, composition, or duration of the advisory <u>board</u> 27 [committee] or to the appointment of the <u>board's</u> [committee's]

1 presiding officer.

8 (2) is employed by or participates in the management 9 of a business entity or other organization regulated by or 10 receiving money from the department;

(3) owns or controls, directly or indirectly, more than a 10 percent interest in a business entity or other organization regulated by or receiving money from the department;

14 (4) uses or receives a substantial amount of tangible 15 goods, services, or money from the department other than 16 compensation or reimbursement authorized by law for <u>board</u> 17 [<u>committee</u>] membership, attendance, or expenses; or

Sec. 1151.055. COMPENSATION; REIMBURSEMENT. [(a)] A board [committee] member may not receive compensation for the member's services.

MEMBERSHIP RESTRICTIONS. 22 A person is not eligible for appointment as a member of the board [council] if the 23 24 person is: 25 (1) required to register with the secretary of state under Chapter 305, Government Code; 26 (2) required to register with the department under 27

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1 Chapter 1151; or

2 (3) exempt from the registration requirements imposed
3 by this chapter, except as provided by Section 1152.102.

Sec. 1152.104. TERMS; VACANCY. (a) Members of the <u>board</u>

terms of two members expiring on February 1 of each year].

A <u>board</u> [council] member is entitled to reimbursement for reasonable expenses incurred in performing duties as a member, subject to applicable limitations in the General Appropriations Act.
